13	WHEREAS, the City created a City-wide Grants Program to centralize			
15	grants management and grants development activities including accounting,			
16	compliance, identification of grant opportunities, and coordination of City-wide			
17	applications. The goal of the program is to safeguard grant dollars, and increase			
18	grant revenues in order to offset costs of City projects, programs and services;			
19	and			
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21	WHEREAS, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) introduced			
22	new standards (NFPA 1710) on minimum staffing levels recommended for			
23	responding to various emergency situations; and			
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25	WHEREAS, the International Association of Fire Chiefs has estimated			
26	that 2/3 of America's fire departments do not meet the NFPA staffing standards,			
27	and that 75,000 new firefighters would be needed to bring these departments into			
28	compliance; and			
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30	WHEREAS, the SAFER grant was created to help fire departments meet			
31	"industry minimum standards" prescribed by NFPA Standard 1710, to attain 24-			
32	hour staffing to provide adequate protection from fire and fire-related hazards,			
33	and to respond to emergencies; and			
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35	WHEREAS, a total of \$350,000,000 was appropriated for the 2018			
36	SAFER Grant Program, which then awards three (3) year grants to assist fire			
37 38	departments by funding a portion of the salaries and benefits of the SAFER- funded positions; and			

WHEREAS, on January 9, 2019 City Commission via Resolution 2019001 approved the submission of grant applications, which includes the SAFER
grant listed as item No.: 37; and

WHEREAS, on March 22, 2019 pursuant to City Commission approval,
the City submitted the SAFER grant application for hiring fourteen (14) additional
firefighter personnel; and

48 WHEREAS, on September 18, 2019, the City received notification of 49 grant award approval in the amount of five million six hundred ninety-two 50 thousand four hundred twenty-eight (\$5,692,428) dollars. The grant award 51 includes approval of an Economic Hardship Waiver which waived the City's local 52 match amount of \$2,182,097 dollars; and

54 **WHEREAS**, due to potential liability, the additional 14 new positions must 55 be approved by the City Commission; and

57 WHEREAS, acceptance of the SAFER grant award will provide funding 58 solely for salary and benefit costs for the fourteen (14) additional new firefighter 59 positions. However, the cost of equipment to outfit the 14 new firefighter 60 positions at an estimated cost of \$49, 000 dollars (\$3,500 per firefighter) is not 61 included in the SAFER grant award; and

63 WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission deem it to be in the best 64 interest of the citizens and residents of the City of Hallandale Beach to authorize 65 City Administration to accept the SAFER grant award and to authorize 66 acceptance of grant application award and the execution of any and all related 67 grant documents.

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69NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY70COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

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SECTION 1. The above clauses are incorporated in full in this Resolution.

SECTION 2. City Manager's Authorization. The Mayor and City Commission hereby authorize the City Manager to accept the SAFER grant application award of five million six hundred ninety-two thousand four hundred twenty-eight (\$5,692,428) dollars in federal funding and approve 14 additional firefighter positions and the cost of equipment to outfit the 14 new firefighter positions. The City Manager is further authorized to execute any and all grant documents to effectuate acceptance of award.
