RESOLUTION NO. 2019 -**

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, ENCOURAGING THE STATE LEGISLATURE TO APPROVE SENATE BILL 182, AND ANY COMPANION HOUSE BILLS RELATING TO THE PREEMPTION OF RECYCLABLE AND POLYSTYRENE MATERIALS BY AMENDING SECTION 403.7033 AND SECTION 500.90, FLORIDA STATUTES, REPEALING THE PREEMPTION OF LOCAL LAWS REGARDING THE USE OR SALE OF SINGLE-USE PLASTIC BAGS AND POLYSTYRENE MATERIALS.; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

21 **WHEREAS**, the City of Hallandale Beach is diligent in its efforts to preserve the
22 beautiful environment that supports the tourism industry which is so vital to the economy
23 of the City of Hallandale Beach and the State of Florida; and

25 **WHEREAS**, plastic bags and polystyrene are detrimental because they do not
26 fully degrade in our oceans or land environment and they introduce unsafe chemicals
27 into our environment; and

29 **WHEREAS**, plastic bags and polystyrene create the potential for death of land
30 and marine animals through entanglement and ingestion; and
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32 **WHEREAS**, the expansive usage of single-use shopping bags and polystyrene
33 containers and their typical disposal rates creates an impediment to the City's waste
34 reduction and recycling goals while creating unsightly litter; and
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36 **WHEREAS**, single-use plastic bags and polystyrene containers are difficulty to
37 recycle and frequently contaminate materials that is processed through the City's
38 recycling programs;

40 **WHEREAS**, reusable bags and biodegradable containers are considered to be
41 the best option to reduce waste and litter, protect wildlife and conserve resources; and
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43 **WHEREAS**, commission acknowledges some businesses have taken affirmative
44 steps to accomplish this goal and recognizes their proactive efforts; and
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46 **WHEREAS**, it is in the public interest for the Commission to encourage and
47 enable the location of a viable reusable bag manufacturing operation in the State of
48 Florida; and

50 **WHEREAS**, it is in the public interest for the Florida Legislature to provide
51 statewide deregulation of the proliferation of single-use shopping bags and polystyrene
52 containers; and

54 **WHEREAS**, the Florida Legislature under “The Energy, Climate Change, and
55 Economic Security Act of 2008”, enacted house Bill 7135, creating Sections 403.7033
56 and 500.90, Florida Statutes; and

58 **WHEREAS**, Section 403.7033 requires the Florida Department of Environmental
59 Protection (DEP) to perform an analysis and submit a report to the Legislature by
60 February 1, 2010, regarding the necessity and efficacy of both statewide and local
61 regulation of bags used by consumers to carry products from retail establishments; and
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63 **WHEREAS**, the statute also provides that until such time that the Legislature
64 adopts the recommendations of DEP, no local or state government may enact any
65 regulation or tax on the use of such retail bags; and
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67 **WHEREAS**, the DEP analysis determined a need for new or different regulations
68 of bags used by customers to carry products from retail establishments and
69 recommends the implementation of new standards requiring the prohibition of plastic
70 carryout bags encourages the use of reusable bags to the benefit of the State’s
71 environment; and

WHEREAS, Section 500.90 preempts local regulation of the use or sale of polystyrene products; and

WHEREAS, the Commission supports the efforts to repeal Section 403.7033 and 500.90, Florida Statutes, so that local government can enact appropriate legislation relating to the regulation of plastic bags and polystyrene containers.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The City Commission hereby supports efforts to repeal Sections 403.7033 and 500.90, Florida Statutes, so that local governments are no longer preempted from enacting appropriate legislation relating to the regulation of plastic bags and polystyrene containers.

SECTION 2. This City Commission encourages approval of Senate Bill 182 and all companion House Bills eliminating preemption language in Sections 403.7033 and 500.90, Florida Statutes.

SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.
