RESOLUTION NO. 2020 -

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING PRESIDENT DONALD J. TRUMP'S EXECUTIVE ORDER COMBATING THE RISE OF ANTI-SEMITISM AND ANTI-SEMITIC INCIDENTS IN THE UNITED STATES AND AROUND THE WORLD WHICH AIMS TO PROTECT THE APPROXIMATELY 2,900 JEWISH HOUSEHOLDS, AND THE APPROXIMATELY 900 EASILY IDENTIFIABLE MEMBERS OF THE ORTHODOX JEWISH COMMUNITY LIVING IN HALLANDALE BEACH AND SUSCEPTIBLE TO ANTI-SEMITIC ATTACKS; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO DISTRIBUTE AS APPROPRIATE; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHEREAS, anti-Semitic incidents and speech are becoming more blatant and pronounced, with the latest face of anti-Semitism being the anti-Jewish and anti-Israel Boycott, Divestment and Sanctions (BDS) movement. BDS is NOT a peaceful movement but is a cover up for anti-Semitic attacks on Jews in the United States, Israel and around the World, with the ultimate goal being the elimination of Jews, especially the 6,000,000 Jews living in Israel; and

WHEREAS, President Donald J. Trump's executive order states: Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 (Title VI), 42 U.S.C. 2000d et seq., prohibits discrimination on the basis of race, color, and national origin in programs and activities receiving Federal financial assistance, and since Title VI does not cover discrimination based on religion, It shall be the policy of the executive branch to enforce Title VI against prohibited forms of discrimination rooted in anti-Semitism as vigorously as against all other forms of discrimination prohibited by Title VI; and

WHEREAS, the United States Department of Justice defines Hate Crimes as having a devastating effect beyond the harm inflicted on any victim. They reverberate through families, communities, and the entire nation, as others fear that they too could be threatened, attacked, or forced from their homes, because of what they look like, who they are, where they worship, whom they love, or whether they have a disability; and

WHEREAS, our Country faces increased violent and murderous incidents of anti-Semitic attacks against Jews; The City of Hallandale Beach recognizes the approximately

2,900 Jewish households, and our approximately 900 easily identifiable and susceptible to anti-Semitic attacks members of the Orthodox Jewish community living in Hallandale Beach; and

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have zero tolerance for anti-Semitism and hate speech within city limits against our Jewish residents and hereby commit to standing firmly with members of the Jewish community against any such acts. The Mayor and City of Hallandale Beach commissioners hereby demand that State and Federal prosecuting agencies aggressively prosecute Hate Crimes as defined by the Department of Justice like those protected by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. and will request any and all State and Federal Funding available to assist in fighting and combating anti-Semitism and hate crimes.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Aware of the increased violent and murderous incidents of anti-Semitic attacks against Jews, the Mayor and City Commission hereby denounce verbal and physical attacks on the Jewish community and support President Trump's executive order to enforce Title VI against prohibited forms of discrimination rooted in anti-Semitism as vigorously as against all other forms of discrimination prohibited by Title VI. Further, the Mayor and City of Hallandale Beach commissioners hereby demand that State and Federal prosecuting agencies aggressively prosecute Hate Crimes as defined by the Department of Justice like those protected by Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. and will request any and all State and Federal Funding available to assist in fighting and combating anti-Semitism and hate crimes.

SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
