## SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING THE PIGGY-BACKING OF THE STATE OF FLORIDA DEPARTMENT OF MANAGEMENT SERVICES CONTRACT # 781118-15-1 CAR RENTAL SERVICES FROM EAN SERVICES (ENTERPRISE RENT A CAR) IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED SIX THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED SIXTY (\$106,860) DOLLARS FOR FISCAL YEAR 2018-19; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

#### STAFF SUMMARY:

#### **Background and Summary:**

The City of Hallandale Beach Police Department's (HBPD) Strategic Intelligence Unit (SIU) has an ongoing need to rent vehicles for their day to day operations. The ability to maintain an active rotation of unmarked, indistinguishable "police" vehicles for use in patrol and undercover operations makes it less likely that officers are recognized, which is a key element to the success of such operations, as well as for officer safety.

Accordingly, The City of Hallandale Beach Police Department seeks to enter into a contract with Enterprise Leasing Company of Florida, LLC, for the rental of automobiles, vans and sports utility vehicles required to conduct patrol and undercover functions by piggybacking off the City of Coral Springs and Enterprise Leasing Company of Florida, LLC (hereinafter referred to as Enterprise), Contract #17-C-053.

#### **Current Situation:**

The funds for this contract will be provided by the General Fund and the Equitable Sharing Fund. \$52,752 from the General Fund's MUPD3 account and \$29,520 from the Equitable Sharing Fund, totaling \$82,272. The Risk Management Liability Fund will not be accessed for payment during this contract toward liability insurance, as neither Enterprise nor other reputable Rental Companies are offering liability coverage for their vehicles to Law Enforcement. Coverage for collision is factored in to the rates and covered by Enterprise.

The initial term of the City of Coral Springs contract is July 29th, 2017 to August 31st, 2021. Enterprise has many offices in South Florida and has a sufficient selection of cars, sports utility vehicles, trucks, and vans from which staff may choose depending on the need. Moreover, staff may exchange vehicles or obtain replacement vehicles at any time and at any of the Enterprise Rent-A-Car locations in South Florida.

Currently, there are five (5) sworn police detectives that utilize unmarked police vehicles. Should the Department not have access to a variety of car models and types, patrol and undercover operations would be severely hindered as suspects would begin to identify these vehicles as unmarked police cars. The use of rental vehicles is the best option for these types of units as it saves the City of Hallandale Beach in car repairs, purchases, and upkeep, while serving the Department's needs to effectively carry out law enforcement efforts throughout the City.

Anecdotally, in December, as a result of a six month long surveillance operation named HI-CAP, detectives using a multitude of unmarked vehicles, along with multiple Local, State and Federal Law Enforcement Agencies, apprehended nineteen (19) members of a criminal organization. Operation HI-CAP was an initiative born as a response to a spike in violent crime within the CRA in the City of Hallandale Beach. Of the nineteen (19) arrests, nine (9) were from the City of FILE NO. 19-522

Hallandale Beach. The operation garnered the recovery of four (4) firearms and over five hundred and sixty five (565) grams of various narcotics. This operation would not have been possible without the use and availablilty of multiple unmarked vehicles for surveillance.

#### Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Chapter 23, Section 23-8 Exception to Bid Requirements, (6) Bids and Contracts from Other entities, and Section 23-9 Cooperative Purchasing, the City Manager is authorized to procure all supplies, materials, equipment and services from other governmental units, when the best interests of the City would be served subject to the requirement that any purchase in excess of \$50,000 requires City Commission approval.

As the aforementioned purchase will be in excess of the City Manager's purchasing authority, City Commission authorization is required.

#### **Cost Benefit:**

The procurement and deployment of an active rotation of unmarked, indistinguishable "police" vehicles through purchasing would not be timely or cost effective. This process is the optimum means to obtain this service.

## PROPOSED ACTION:

The City Commission consider the attached Resolution authorizing the City Manager to contract for car rental services with Enterprise Leasing Company of Florida, LLC for a period of one (1) year, effective October 1, 2019 in the amount of \$82,272.
