A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH REPEALING
RESOLUTION NO. 2017-56; REINSTATING THE "CITIZEN
RECOGNITION PROGRAM" TO RENAME/DESIGNATE CITY
STREET(S), FACILITIES, PARKS, OR OTHER CITY OWNED
PROPERTY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

WHERAS, the City of Hallandale beach enacted the "Citizen Recognition Program" in 2013 after the City Commission then directed staff to research best practices regarding a citizen recognition program to evaluate the feasibility of implementing a policy to outline criteria for renaming City street(s), facilities, and parks; and

WHEREAS, staff at the time researched the recognition programs of other municipalities in the tri-county area as well as contacting the Cities of Fort Lauderdale and Miramar in gathering the best practices for City Commission consideration of approval leading to the creating of Resolution 2013-92; and

WHEREAS, on April 4th, 2016 the City Commission directed staff to research best practices regarding street co-designation and to bring forth recommendations to amend the policies of Resolution 2013-92 to address concerns of applications received by the City and staff recommended the following amendments to the policy in which there will be two (2) application periods from January 1st to March 30th and August 1st to October 30th; and

WHEREAS, the policy would require signed petition as part of the application of street co-designation to include signatures of at least fifty percent (50%) of all affected property owners and/or tenants currently residing on proposed street, and capping expenditures associated with the renaming of City streets, facility, or buildings at five thousand dollars (\$5,000);

WHEREAS, the City Commission rescinded Resolution 2013-92 and Resolution 2016-61 and therefore rescinded the "Citizen Recognition Program" through Resolution 2017-56.

31 32 33 34	WHEREAS , the City Commission also wishes to include within the policy that it may, with a supermajority of votes on the Commission, rename/designate City street(s), facilities, and parks after informing affected property owners/tenants of the Commission's intent and providing a thirty day (30) period for owners to contest the decision.
35 36	WHEREAS , the Mayor and City Commission of Hallandale Beach wish to resume the "Citizen Recognition Program" as stated in Exhibit A, attached hereto.
37 38	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
39	SECTION 1. Each of the above recitals are hereby incorporated herein.
40 41	SECTION 2. The Mayor and City Commission of Hallandale Beach hereby reinstate the "Citizen Recognition Program" as stated in Exhibit A.
42	SECTION 3. Resolution 2017-56 is hereby repealed.
