10	Bill 1302, increasing the per occurrence limits on the collectability of judgments against
11	government entities from \$300,000 to \$500,000 and eliminating the \$200,000 per claiman
12	limit; and
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14	WHEREAS, the new limits would apply to lawsuits that have not been adjudicate
15	before the effective date of Senate Bill 1302, therefore, making the new higher monetary
16	limits retroactive; and
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18	WHEREAS, of passed Senate Bill 1302 would force local governments to increase
19	property taxes to pay for the higher liability amounts, the likely increase in the number of
20	lawsuits filed against government entities and higher insurance premiums; and
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22	WHEREAS, the City opposes Senate Bill 1302; and

24	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission believe it is in the best interest of the
25	City to approve this Resolution; and
