ORDINANCE NO. 2020 -

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA;
CALLING FOR A GENERAL ELECTION ON NOVEMBER
3, 2020 TO ELECT THE SEATS OF MAYOR,
COMMISSIONER SEAT #3 AND COMMISSIONER SEAT
#4 TO THE CITY COMMISSION FOR A FOUR YEAR TERM;
SETTING THE QUALIFYING PERIOD FOR
COMMENCEMENT ON JUNE 8, 2020 AT 12:00 PM AND
ENDING ON JUNE 12, 2020 AT 12:00 PM; PROVIDING FOR
SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE
DATE.**

WHEREAS, Section 4.01 of the City of Hallandale Beach Charter provides that the City Commission, by ordinance and subject to the provision of its Charter, shall have the power to call Regular and Special Elections as may be required by the City; and

WHEREAS, the terms of Mayor, Commission Seat 3 and Seat 4 currently occupied by Mayor Joy F. Cooper (Mayor), Commissioner Anabelle Lima-Taub (Seat 3) and Commissioner Michele Lazarow (Seat 4) will expire upon the November 2020 General Election, whereby the electorates of the City will elect at-large officials to these seats for a four (4) year term; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The Mayor and City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach hereby call for a General Election to elect the seats of the Mayor, Commissioner Seat #3 and Commissioner Seat #4 for a four-year term on November 3, 2020.

SECTION 2. The Qualifying Period for all candidates will commence on June 8, 2020 at 12:00 PM (noon) and end at 12:00 PM (noon) on June 12, 2020.

SECTION 2. The City Clerk is authorized and directed to publish notice of the election, as required by law, and to take all other measures necessary to conduct the election.

SECTION 3. Conflict. In the event of a conflict or conflicts between this Ordinance and any other ordinance, or between this Ordinance and a provision of the Florida Election Code, Chapters 97-106, Florida Statutes that does not expressly apply to municipalities, or any other provision of law, this Ordinance controls to the extent allowable under the law..

SECTION 4. Severability. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion thereof, other than the part that is declared to be invalid.

SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
