4 5 7 8 9 10	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, SUPPORTING THE ADL'S (ANTI-DEFAMATION LEAGUE) ANTI-HATE RESOLUTION STANDING AGAINST THE TARGETING OF INDIVIDUAL COMMUNITIES DURING THE COVID-19 PANDEMIC; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
11	WHEREAS, since the outbreak of the COVID-19 virus, according to the Centers
12	for Disease Control and Prevention, 1,364,061 cases and 82,246 deaths have been
13	reported in the United States as of May 13, 2020; and
14	
15	WHEREAS, COVID-19 will not be stopped by political boundaries and was not
16	created or caused by any race, nationality or ethnicity, and the World Health Organization
17	has cautioned against using geographic descriptors that can fuel ethnic and racial
18	discrimination; and
19	
20	WHEREAS, COVID-19 has infected people from all racial, national and ethnic
21	backgrounds; and
22	
23	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach is fully committed to the safety, security,
24 25	and equal treatment of its residents as it confronts the COVID-19 pandemic; and
25 26	WHEREAS, each individual has the ability to promote inclusiveness, celebrate
20	diversity, support all fellow community members, prevent the spread of misinformation,
28	and reject hate and bias in all forms; and
29	
30	WHEREAS, hate crimes, discrimination and aggression against Asians and Jews
31	are on the rise throughout the country as these groups are being blamed for the COVID-
32	19 outbreak and spread; and
33	
34	WHEREAS, as our history has shown, times of great fear, uncertainty and unrest
35	can lead to the demonization, blaming, and scapegoating of groups as the "other;" and
36	

37 WHEREAS, extremists are taking advantage of COVID-19 to spread their hateful 38 ideologies, including antisemitism, racism, Islamophobia, and Sinophobia; and 39 WHEREAS, amid the growing spread of COVID-19, there are surging reports of 40 41 bias-motivated incidents targeting members of the Asian and Pacific Islander community 42 in the U.S.; and 43 WHEREAS, COVID-19 is a public health issue, not a racial, religious or ethnic one, 44 and the deliberate use of terms such as "Chinese virus" or "Kung Fu virus" to describe 45 COVID-19 only encourages hate crimes and incidents against Asians and further spreads 46 47 misinformation at a time when communities should be working together to get through this 48 crisis: and 49 50 WHEREAS, the Jewish community has been targeted with blame, hate, antisemitic 51 tropes and conspiracy theories about their creating, spreading and profiting from COVID-52 19; and 53 54 WHEREAS, to target and stigmatize specific communities for the COVID-19 55 outbreak and world-wide spread creates an inexcusable risk to all community members; 56 and 57 58 WHEREAS, it is critical that the City of Hallandale Beach take leadership and stand 59 in solidarity with its Asian and Jewish communities to send a message that discriminatory and hate-motivated behavior or violence will not be tolerated; and 60 61 62 WHEREAS, all persons are encouraged to report any such antisemitic, 63 discriminatory or racist incidents to the proper authorities for investigation; and 64 WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission wish to affirm their commitment to 65 the well-being and safety of its Asian and Jewish community members and ensure they 66 67 know they are not alone and that the City of Hallandale Beach is committed to ending the 68 spread of all forms of hate and bigotry. . 69

## NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

72 73 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein. 74 **SECTION 2.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby pronounce: 75 76 The City of Hallandale Beach denounces antisemitism, anti-Asian bigotry, 1. 77 and all hateful speech, violent action and the spread of misinformation related to 78 COVID-19 that casts blame, promotes racism or discrimination or harms the City 79 of Hallandale Beach Asian and Pacific Islander, Jewish, immigrant or other communities. 80 81 2. 82 The City of Hallandale Beach joins cities, counties and states across the 83 country in affirming its commitment to the safety and well-being of all community 84 members, including the Asian and Jewish communities, and in combatting hate 85 crimes targeting Asians, Jews and Pacific Islanders. 86 87 3. The City of Hallandale Beach will continue its efforts to protect residents 88 and targets and victims of hate, and to prosecute and curb hate acts related to 89 COVID-19. 90 4. 91 The City of Hallandale Beach pledges to support the inalienable rights of 92 all people in our community, who should be treated with respect and must remain 93 safe during this pandemic. We call upon all our residents to treat each other with 94 respect. 95 5. 96 The City of Hallandale Beach urges residents to join us in calling attention 97 to these harms and denouncing hate to help keep us all safe during this 98 unprecedented pandemic and beyond. 99 **SECTION 3.** Effective Date.
