6 7	IN CHAPTER 2 "ADMINISTRATION" ARTICLE III "BOARDS, COMMITTEES, DISTRICTS AND AUTHORITIES"; TO APPLY
8	GENERAL ADVISORY BOARD PROVISIONS; PROVIDING FOR
9 10	CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; PROVIDING FOR CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE
11	DATE.

13	WHEREAS, the water activities, beaches and waters available to residents and
14	visitors play a major role in the character of the City of Hallandale Beach; and
15	
16	WHEREAS, beach erosion, beach cleanliness, dune preservation and other
17	environmental issues are a concern for the resiliency of the City of Hallandale Beach; and
18	
19	WHEREAS, the City desires to be proactive and address such issues by implementing
20	policies or programs that promote efficient, cost effective building and infrastructure
21	improvements and policies that protect and mitigate any damage to the City's beaches, buildings,
22	infrastructure and environment; and
23	
24	WHEREAS, a committee of engaged residents, expert knowledge and experience on the
25	issues of resiliency, beach erosion, cleanliness, dune and shoreline preservation will produce the
26	best and most effective policies; and
27	
28	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach desires to adopt the best policies and practices
29	regarding beach preservation; and
30	
31	WHEREAS, the City Commission wishes to create a board which will encourage a healthy
32	and friendly marine environment for residents and visitors;
33	
34	WHEREAS, the City Commission finds that it is necessary to establish the board to study
35	and recommend policies and programs that address beach erosion, dunes, shorelines,
36	cleanliness and improve natural and engineered resources, prevent harm to the natural and built
37	environment, and benefit the social, economic and environmental wellbeing of the community for
38	present and future generations; and

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40	WHEREAS, the board shall identify, study and propose policies for the City Commission's					
41	consideration for the purpose of implementing sustainable and resilient policies; and

43	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission find that establishing the board is in the best					
44	interest of the City; and

46	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY					
47	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

49	SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are hereby incorporated herein.

51	SECTION 2. Chapter 2 "Administration" of the Code of Ordinances of the City of					
52	Hallandale Beach, Florida, Division 2, "Advisory Boards and Committees" is amended to read as					
53	follows as indicated for additions (in underlining) and deletions (in strikethrough):

55	ARTICLE III- BOARDS, COMMITTEES, DISTRICTS, AND AUTHORITIES					
56	DIVISION 2. ADVISORY BOARDS AND COMMITTEES					
57	Sec. 2- 109 BEACH PRESERVATION ADVISORY BOARD					
58	(a) There is hereby created a Beach Preservation board as an advisory board to the city					
59	commission of the City of Hallandale Beach.					
60						
61	(b) Members. The board shall be composed of five members and two alternate members.					
62	Each commissioner shall appoint one regular member and entire commission body to					
63	vote by majority on two alternate members. Board members (regular and alternates)					
64	living directly on the City's oceanside, Intracoastal or other dwellings within the City's					
65	waterways will have precedence for appointments by each commissioner. If there are					
66	two candidates for the same appointment, the commissioner must appoint the					
67	candidate who has a direct interest/dwelling on the City's oceanside, Intracoastal or					
68	City's waterways. Alternate members may be at-large from within the City's limits with					
69	no requirement to rent or own real property directly on the City's oceanside,					
70	Intracoastal or City's waterways.

72	(c) In addition to those responsibilities required of all advisory boards and committees,					
73	the Beach Preservation board shall endeavor the following:

110	(e) The Board shall meet a minimum of once every six weeks and provide					
111	recommendations, or a report, to the City Commission, at the board's discretion. However,					
112	a bi-annual report with recommendations to the City Commission is mandatory. Any					
113	regular member of the Board shall have the ability to call additional meetings upo					
114	affirmative vote of the Board.					
115						
116	SECTION 3. Conflict. All ordinances or portions of the Code of Ordinances of the City					
117	of Hallandale Beach in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance shall be repealed to the extent					
118	of such conflict.

120	SECTION 4. Severability. Should any provision of this ordinance be declared by a court					
121	of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, the same shall not affect the validity of the ordinance as a					
122	whole, or any part thereof, other than the part declared to be invalid.					
123						
124	SECTION 4. Codification. It is intent of the Mayor and City Commission that the					
125	provisions of this ordinance be incorporated into the Code of Ordinances; to effect such intention					
126	the words "ordinance" or "section" may be changed to other appropriate words.					
127						
128	SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon adoption.
