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4 5 6 7 8 9	A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA EXPRESSING ITS OPPOSITION TO OFFSHORE DRILLING ACTIVITIES, INCLUDING SEISMIC AIRGUN BLASTING; AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO TRANSMIT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE APPROPRIATE OFFICIALS; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
11	WHEREAS, the federal government has expressed interest in opening the waters
12	off the coast of Florida to offshore oil and gas development and exploration, including risky
13	methods such as seismic airgun blasting; and
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15	WHEREAS, in January 2018, the Department of the Interior released its draft
16	2019-2024 national Outer Continental Shelf (OCS) Oil and Gas Leasing Program which
17	governs when and where the Bureau of Ocean Energy Management can offer offshore
18	drilling leases to the oil and gas industry; and
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20	WHEREAS, the Program proposes to open over 90% of total OCS acreage to dirty
21	and dangerous offshore drilling which would open the Atlantic and Pacific to drilling for the
22	first time in three decades and outlines the largest number of potential offshore leases
23	ever offered by any president; and
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25	WHEREAS, exploratory and commercial drilling, extraction, and transportation of
26	offshore oil and gas resources pose a significant risk of an oil spill and leakage; and
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28	WHEREAS, eventual offshore drilling may require significant onshore
29	infrastructure such as pipelines or refineries, which would harm the character of the coast;
30	and
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32	WHEREAS, offshore drilling proposals threaten the continued prosperity of coastal
33	communities and states whose economies are inextricably linked to clean, oil-free
34	shorelines; and.

36	WHEREAS, communities along the Atlantic Coast rely on healthy ocean
37	ecosystems to support jobs in fishing, recreation and tourism; and
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39	WHEREAS, offshore drilling activities pose threats to treasured vacation
40	destinations on Florida's coasts which are of intrinsic economic value for numerous
41	industries and serve as essential nursery habitats for recreational commercially important
42	fisheries; and
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44	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach recognizes that the tourism and fishing
45	industries, which depend on a healthy and vibrant coastal environment, both serve as
46	major economic drivers benefiting the current and future residents, property owners, and
47	visitors to Florida; and
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49	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach endeavors to be a good steward of the
50	state and region' environment and its resources; and
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52	WHEREAS, exploration and development of oil and gas resources off the coast of
53	Florida will not effectively address the long-term energy needs of our country; and
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55	WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach finds it more economically and
56	ecologically responsible to pursue non-polluting sources of renewable energy, such as
57	solar and wind, which pose less risk to the coastal environment and economic health
58	before using uncertain methods of seismic airgun blasting for offshore oil and gas
59	deposits; and
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61	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission find that expressing its opposition to
62	offshore drilling activities, including seismic airgun blasting, is in the best interests of its
63	citizens; and
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65	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY
66	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
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68	SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein.

71	to offshore drilling activities, including seismic airgun blasting.

75	Florida Senate, the Speaker of the Florida House of Representatives, the Broward County

77	the Florida Association of Counties, the Florida City County Management Association, the
78	Board of County Commissioners for Broward County, and each of the municipalities in
79	Broward County.
