4 A RESOLUTION OF THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE  
5 BEACH, FLORIDA, CALLING FOR SAFETY FOR BROWARD COUNTY  
6 STUDENTS, TEACHERS AND SCHOOL EMPLOYEES AND SAVING  
7 TAXPAYER DOLLARS ON BULK PURCHASING OF PPE (PERSONAL  
8 PROTECTIVE EQUIPMENT) BEFORE BROWARD COUNTY SCHOOLS  
9 REOPEN FOR FACE-TO-FACE LEARNING; FURTHER DIRECTING THE CITY  
10 CLERK TO TRANSMIT A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE OFFICIALS  
11 NAMED HEREIN; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

14 **WHEREAS**, the City of Hallandale Beach (the "City"), its Mayor, City Commission, hereby  
15 express concern for the health and wellbeing of all Broward County students (transitional  
16 kindergarten through 12th grade) as well as all Broward County teachers, school bus drivers and  
17 support staff (including custodians); and  
18

19 **WHEREAS**, the City supports the safety for all school employees and students as well as  
20 saving taxpayer dollars via bulk purchasing; and  
21

22 **WHEREAS**, public schools in Broward County play an essential role in the educational  
23 and social development of children and in the functioning of the economy; and  
24

25 **WHEREAS**, the need to reopen schools this fall is essential, but should be done with  
26 careful consideration, prioritizing the safety of students and their families, teachers and school  
27 support staff, school bus drivers, and the broader community, but not without implementing and  
28 procuring supplemental resources such as hygiene products and PPE (personal protective  
29 equipment); and

31           **WHEREAS**, personal protective equipment is essential to reduce the risk of infection  
32 including wearing a mask or face shield, using gloves when appropriate, washing hands, using  
33 hand sanitizer (when age appropriate), sanitizing common surfaces and cleaning schools; and  
34

35           **WHEREAS**, personal protective equipment is especially important for staff and students  
36 with special health care needs; and

37           **WHEREAS**, the Center for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC) recommends that  
38 schools support healthy hygiene behaviors by providing adequate supplies, including soap, hand  
39 sanitizer with at least 60 percent alcohol (for staff and older children who can safely use hand  
40 sanitizer), paper towels, tissues, disinfectant wipes, cloth face coverings (as feasible) and no-  
41 touch/foot pedal trash cans, and

42           **WHEREAS**, the CDC recommends that schools clean and disinfect frequently touched  
43 surfaces (e.g., playground equipment, door handles, sink handles, drinking fountains) within the  
44 school and on school buses at least daily or between use as much as possible; and

45           **WHEREAS**, Broward County School leaders must develop cleaning and disinfection  
46 safety protocols, and procure a series of supplemental resources to support districts and schools  
47 as they implement these protocols; and

48           **WHEREAS**, buying PPE in bulk reduces the cost per unit and can reduce how much  
49 Broward County pays in the long run on supplies and products; and  
50

**WHEREAS**, family budgets have already been strained as many have been without work or had a decrease in income because of the virus, making childcare essential for many families to be able to return to work; and

**WHEREAS**, most notably, inequities exist within our health system as COVID-19 data shows that our Black and Brown communities are more likely to be infected and die from the virus due to underlying health conditions, social structures, and access to resources.

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

**Section 1. Recitals.** That the recitals and findings contained above are hereby confirmed, adopted and incorporated herein

**Section 2.** This City Commission calls on Broward County education leaders to provide Broward County students, teachers and school employees with PPE (personal protective equipment) which is essential to reduce the risk of infection including wearing a mask or face shield, using gloves when appropriate, washing hands, using hand sanitizer (when age appropriate), sanitizing common surfaces and cleaning schools, and doing so by buying PPE in bulk which reduces the cost per unit and can reduce how much Broward County pays.

**Section 3. Transmittal.** The City Clerk is directed to transmit a copy of this Resolution to the Board of Broward County Public Schools, Broward County Mayor Dale Holness, the Board of Broward County Commissioners, the Executive Director of the Florida League of Cities, and the Broward County League of Cities.

**Section 4. Effective Date .** This Resolution shall take effect upon adoption.
