 - Promote city's overall tree canopy
 - Create a mitigation structure
 - Strengthen tree waiver process
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Key additions to the ordinance

- Definitions section added (64)
- ANSI 300 Standards requirement
- Right Tree Right Place
- 811 before you dig
- All properties are now included
- Appeals to Historic Preservation Board
- Arborist/Florida Landscape Architect

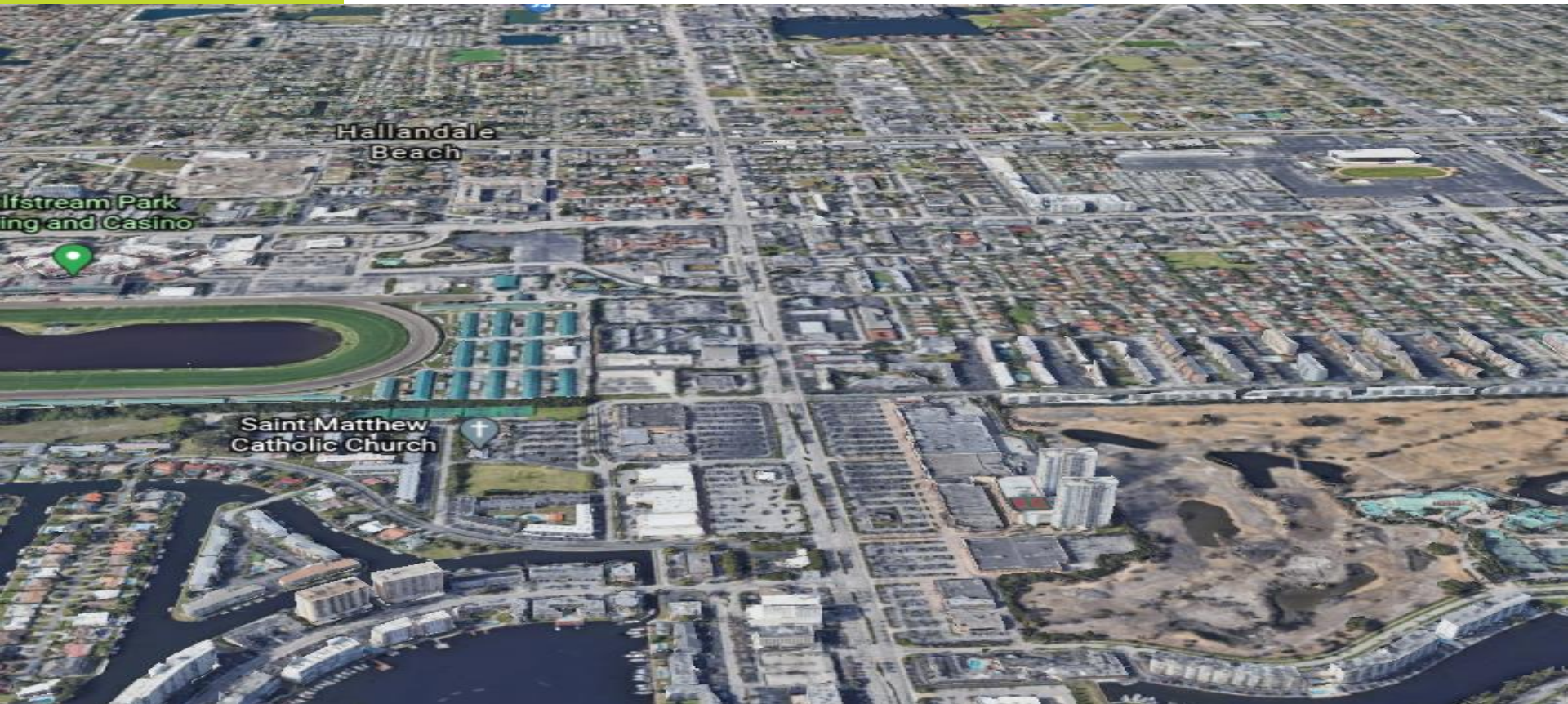
Key additions to the tree replacement ordinance

- Posting on property of approved permit
- Tree mitigation table
- Trust fund training designation
- Trust fund contribution simplified (aka waiver)
- Replacement options (plant off site)

Hallandale Beach only has 14% tree canopy cover

according to the Tree Canopy Assessment currently underway

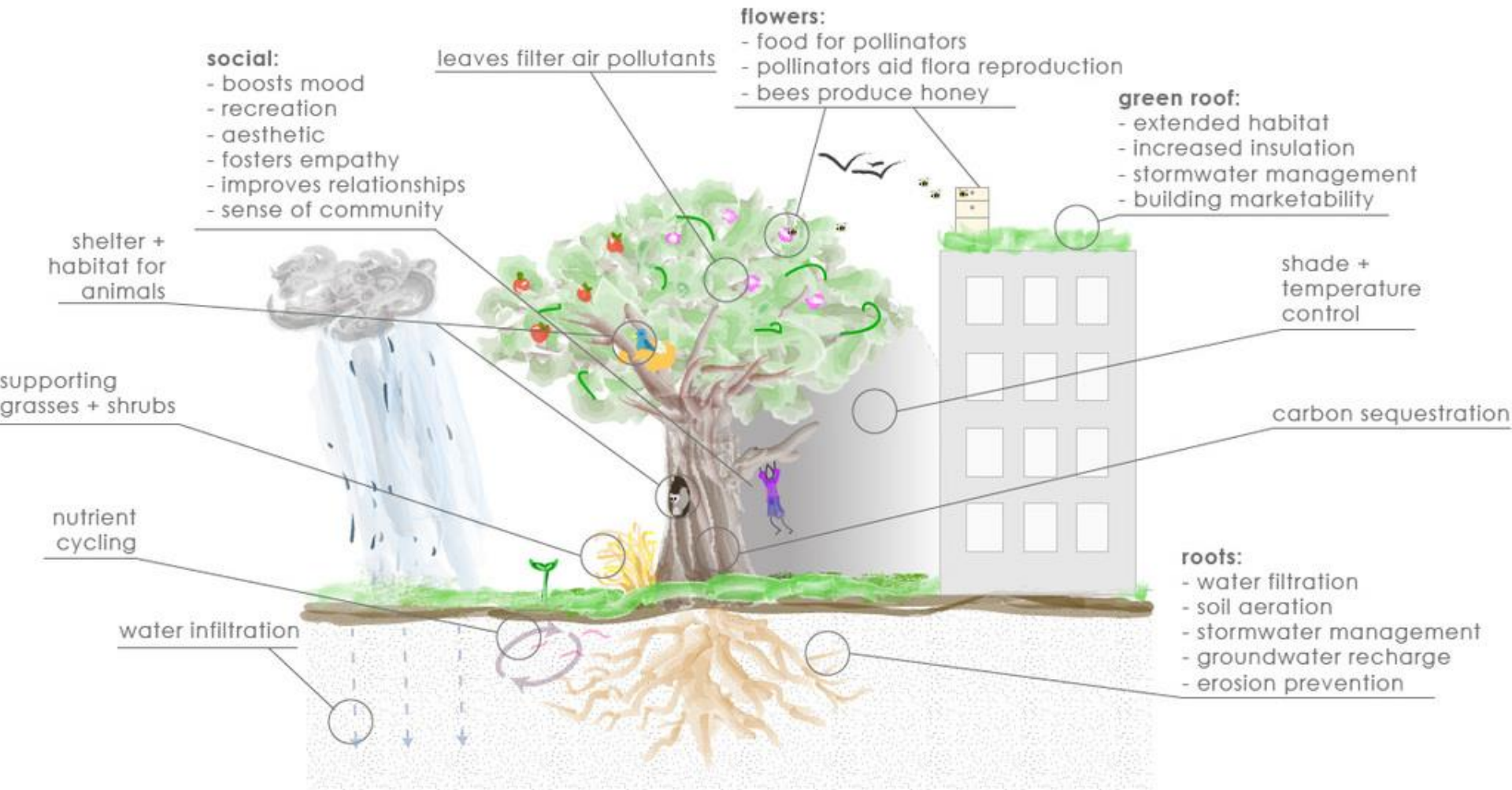
Broward County's goal is for 40% tree canopy cover
