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L5	WHEREAS, weather related disasters are occurring more frequently and with
L6	greater intensity animals are being abandoned negatively impacted; and
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L8	WHEREAS, lack of advance planning and abandonment of animals at AWA-
L9	regulated facilities can jeopardize safety and put additional burden on first responders, the
20	local community and nongovernmental entities that assist with rescue efforts; and
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22	WHEREAS, the Pets Evacuation and Transportation Standards (PETS) Act was
23	enacted in 2006 in response to tragedy of Hurricane Katrina and the 600,000 lives lost,
24	but the legislation was not far-reaching enough and did not cover commercially owned
25	animals; and
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27	WHEREAS, the Prepared Act would require Animal Welfare Act regulated facilities
28	including commercial animal breeders and dealers, research facilities, and exhibitors,
29	zoos, aquariums, and circuses to develop, document, and follow a contingency plan to
30	provide for the humane handling, treatment, transportation, housing and care of its
31	animals in the event of an emergency or disaster; and
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33	WHEREAS, the facilities would be required to annually submit their plans to the
34	USDA and train all employees on emergency procedures; and
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36	WHEREAS, the contingency plans must adhere to a four-step requirement that
37	would: 1. Identify emergency situations that the entity might experience 2. Outline specific
22	tasks to respond to those emergencies 3. Establish a chain of command and identify

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39	personnel responsible for the response tasks and 4. Address materials, resources, and
40	training to handle response and recovery.
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42	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission believe that it is in the best interest
43	of the residents of the City of Hallandale Beach to support the federal PREPARED Act
44	introduced in the 117 th Congress.
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46	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY
47	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
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49	SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein.
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51	SECTION 2. The Mayor and City Commission hereby express their support of
52	the federal PREPARED Act that would require those who are regulated by the animal
53	welfare act to have emergency response plans for natural and manmade disasters to
54	develop, document and follow a contingency plan to provide for humane handling,
55	treatment, transportation, housing and care of its animals in the event of an emergency or
56	disaster. The City Clerk is directed to transmit this resolution to all appropriate entities.
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58	SECTION 3. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon
59	its passage and adoption.
