14	WHEREAS, Section 166.241 authorizes a municipality to amend its adopted		
15	budget anytime during the fiscal year or within sixty (60) days after the end of the fiscal

17	WHEREAS, Section 166.241 (4)(c) provides the process for a municipality to

20	amend an adopted budget when the amendment will change the expenditures and		
20 21	revenues; and		
21	WHEREAS, the FY 2020-2021 adopted budget did not reflect the revenue,		
23	expenditures, appropriations and other miscellaneous adjustments reflected herein; and		
24	WHEREAS, this proposed budget amendment is still within the allotted time		
25	pursuant to Florida Statutes; and		
26 27	WHEREAS, the City Administration proposes that the FY 2020-2021 adopted		
28	budget be amended to include the following transactions:		
29 30 31 32 33	 Innovation Technology – Systems Administrator, Project management, systems migration and upgrades in the amount of \$425,000. These expenditures will be covered by the General Fund reserves; 		
34 35	 \$72,553 for a Procurement Specialist for the Procurement Department. This position will be funded from General Fund reserves; 		
36 37 38 39 40	 Development Services reorganization to include a division for BTR and the new creation of new Certificate of Use program, from new revenues with a new estimated net impact to the General Fund reserves in the amount of \$144,162; 		

41 4. Department of Public Works proposed to allocate \$883,764 from Stormwater Fund 42 Reserves for the Large Diameter Stormwater System Cleaning, Curb Inlets and 43 Catch Basin projects; 44 45 5. Finance is proposing to convert 2 P/T Accounting Clerk positions into a F/T 46 Accounting III position in the Utility Billing Division - net cost savings of \$5,569 to 47 the Utility Fund; 48 49 6. The Finance Department is proposing adding a part-time Billing Specialist to 50 support current deficiencies in the department, costing \$15,501. This expenditure 51 will be covered by the General Fund reserves; 52 53 7. The Utility Billing division is in need of a Customer Relation Representative, which 54 will be funded by the Utility Fund reserves in the amount of \$42,600; 55 56 8. The Parking Management Program will create sustainable parking enforcement. 57 The implementation anticipates increased revenues of \$185,000 and cost for Phase 58 I and II in the amount of \$375,000, with an estimated net deficit of \$190,000. The 59 \$190,000 will be transferred from the General Fund to the Transportation Fund; 60 61 9. Cost of past evaluations that have not been done, costing \$73,000. This 62 expenditure will be covered by the General Fund reserves; 63 64 10. Adding health insurance for part-time School Resource Officers, which are partially 65 funded by the School Board. The amount needed to be covered by the General 66 Fund Reserves is 37,703; 67 68 11. The Fire Station 7 build-out including design will cost \$130,000, which will be funded 69 by General Fund reserves; 70 71 12. Consulting Services for Budget in the amount of \$62,400, which will be funded by 72 General Fund reserves: 73 74 13. Consulting Services for Grants in the amount of \$43,200, which will be funded by 75 General Fund reserves: 76 77 14. 2 Project Managers for the current workload and all the plan utility projects in the 78 amount of \$237,500 are needed. This expenditure will be covered by the Utility 79 Fund reserves: 80 81 15. Contract administrator to oversee all the contracts in the City, the cost for this 82 position is \$98,000 annually. The cost will be split between the General Fund 83 (20%), Stormwater Fund (20%) and Utility Fund (60%), which will be funded by 84 these Funds' reserves; 85 86 87

88 89 90	WHEREAS, this budget amendment will amend the FY 2020-2021 adopted budget
91	as indicated in Attachment A of this ordinance; and
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93	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have determined that it is in the best
94	interest of the City and its residents to amend the FY 2020-2021 adopted budget as
95	reflected in the attachment; and
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97	WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission have determined that this proposed
98	budget amendment is timely under Florida Statutes 166.241 and is being adopted in the
99	same manner as the original adoption of the FY 2020-2021 budget.
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101	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY
102	COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
103 104	SECTION 1. The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are confirmed as true and
105	incorporated herein.

107	SECTION 2. Adoption of Budget Amendment. The Mayor and City
108	Commission hereby adopt the budget amendment to the FY 2020-2021 adopted budget
109	as set forth in Attachments A of this ordinance.

111	SECTION 3. Conflict. All ordinances, parts of ordinances, resolutions, or parts
112	of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict.
113 114	SECTION 4. Severability. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared by
115	a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of
116	this Ordinance as a whole or any portion thereof, other than the part that is declared to be
117	invalid.
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119	SECTION 5. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon
120	adoption.
