**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF
THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING
ADOPTION OF 50BY30: HALLANDALE BEACH'S CLIMATE
ACTION PLAN; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, on March 6, 2019, the Hallandale Beach City Commission passed Resolution 2019-021 affirming the City's commitment to the goals contained in the United Nations IPCC Special Report 15 and authorized commission of a greenhouse gas emission (GHG) inventory to determine the necessary steps to reduce GHG; and

WHEREAS, in March 2020, that first GHG inventory was completed, which established a 2016 baseline of emissions; and

WHEREAS, Staff sought public feedback, and between June 2020 and May 2021, 116 community members provided survey responses and 325 individuals visited and/or engaged on the online Climate Action Plan website www.haveyoursayhallandale.org, the results of which were presented to Staff during a workshop on March 26, 2021 adding detail, identifying synergies with existing plans/efforts, and prioritizing the ideas provided by the public, and which were further refined and presented to the public on June 21, 2021; and

WHEREAS, on May 11, 2021, the City Commission passed a Motion approving acceleration of the City's GHG reduction targets to match the Cities Race to Zero, which new targets represent a fifty percent reduction in GHG by 2030 and net-zero emissions by 2050, which targets are reflected in the City's Climate Action Plan; and

WHEREAS, the City's Climate Action Plan provides a pathway for the City to achieve reducing community wide GHG emissions 50% by 2030, organizing

34 actions into the following six (6) “Action Pathways”: 1) Energy & Buildings, 2) Low
35 Emissions Mobility, 3) Community Waste, 4) Community Greening, 5) Government
36 Operations and 6) Engagement & Partnerships; and

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38 **WHEREAS**, these actions span from projects/programs being developed at
39 the City level to partnering with organizations and agencies to provide services,
40 and a number of actions in the Plan are intended to provide living-wage, part-time
41 green jobs for our residents to assist in the implementation of the Plan itself; and

43 **WHEREAS**, in order to tackle climate change and reduce its most harmful
44 impacts, the onus cannot simply be reduced to individual behavior changes;
45 instead, transformational change operating on processes and behaviors at all
46 levels: individual, communities, businesses, institutions and governments, is
47 necessary; and

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49 **WHEREAS**, the Hallandale Beach City Commission recognizes that the
50 global climate emergency threatens Hallandale Beach, the State of Florida, the
51 United States of America, all other nations, and indeed, the entire world; and

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53 **WHEREAS**, achieving Net-Zero emissions and building a climate-resilient
54 and adaptive society will have a positive impact on the health and wellbeing of
55 residents, and will offer protections from the adverse potential consequences of
56 climate change to Hallandale Beach’s ecosystems and economies; and

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58 **WHEREAS**, the Mayor and City Commission find that adopting and
59 implementing the 50BY30: Hallandale Beach’s Climate Action Plan are in the
60 public interest.

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62 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY**
63 **COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

65 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are incorporated herein.

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67 **SECTION 2.** The Mayor and City Commission hereby authorize adopting
68 and implementing the 50BY30: Hallandale Beach’s Climate Action Plan and
69 authorize the City Manager to sign all related documents to begin implementation.
