



TIF \$17.5M (\$16.5M last year)

Expenditures

- Salaries total of 13 positions -1.2M (1.5M last year)
 - 9 Full time employees
 - 2 CRA 76%, City 24%
 - 1 Part time employee
 - Executive Director \$10,000
- Electric Minibuses \$3.5M
 - EV Bus Station Design & Construction \$1.5M
 - Grant Match \$2M (ILA FY20/21 & FY21/22)
- Redevelopment Agreement-Solaris \$2M
 *Pending agreement structure (\$1M-FY21/22, \$1M-FY22/23)
- 2020 Revenue Note Debt Service \$3.2 (\$2.7M last year)
- Police ILA \$1.9M (\$1.4M last year)
