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4 5 6 7 8 9 10 11 12 13 14 15	A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING THE CITY TO JOIN WITH THE STATE OF FLORIDA AND OTHER LOCAL GOVERNMENTAL UNITS AS A PARTICIPANT IN THE FLORIDA MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING AND FORMAL AGREEMENTS IMPLEMENTING A UNIFIED PLAN; DIRECTING THE CITY CLERK TO PROVIDE A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO THE FLORIDA LEAGUE OF CITIES AND THE FLORIDA ATTORNEY GENERAL; AUTHORIZING THE EXECUTION OF ALL DOCUMENTS NECESSARY TO EFFECTUATE THE INTENT OF THIS RESOLUTION; PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.
17	WHEREAS, the City has suffered harm from the opioid epidemic; and
18	WHEREAS, the City recognizes that the entire State of Florida has suffered harm
19	as a result of the opioid epidemic; and
20	WHEREAS, the State of Florida has filed an action pending in Pasco County,
21	Florida, and a number of Florida Cities and Counties have also filed an action In re:
22	National Prescription Opiate Litigation, MDL No. 2804 (N.D. Ohio) (the "Opioid Litigation")
23	and the City is a litigating participant in that action; and
24	WHEREAS, the State of Florida and lawyers representing certain various local
25	governments involved in the Opioid Litigation have proposed a unified plan for the
26	allocation and use of prospective settlement dollars from opioid related litigation; and
27	WHEREAS, the Florida Memorandum of Understanding (the "Florida Plan") sets
28	forth a framework of a unified plan for the proposed allocation and use of opioid settlement
29	proceeds and it is anticipated that formal agreements implementing the Florida Plan will
30	be entered into at a future date; and
31	WHEREAS, participation in the Florida Plan by a large majority of Florida cities
32	and counties will materially increase the amount of funds to Florida and should improve
33	Florida's relative bargaining position during additional settlement negotiations; and
34	WHEREAS, failure to participate in the Florida Plan will reduce funds available to
35	the State, the City, and every other Florida city and county.

36 37	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:
38	SECTION 1. The Mayor and City Commission find that participation in the Florida
39	Plan would be in the best interest of the City and its citizens in that such a plan ensures
40	that almost all of the settlement funds go to abate and resolve the opioid epidemic and
41	each and every city and county receives funds for the harm that it has suffered.
42	SECTION 2. The Mayor and City Commission hereby express their support of a
43	unified plan for the allocation and use of opioid settlement proceeds as generally
44	described in the Florida Plan, attached hereto as Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.
45	SECTION 3. The City Manager is hereby expressly authorized to execute the
46	Florida Plan in substantially the form contained in Exhibit "A" and incorporated herein.
47	SECTION 4. The City Manager is hereby authorized to execute any formal
48	agreements implementing a unified plan for the allocation and use of opioid settlement
49	proceeds that is not substantially inconsistent with the Florida Plan and this Resolution.
50	SECTION 5. The City Clerk is hereby directed to furnish a certified copy of this
51	Resolution to the Florida League of Cities and to the Attorney General Ashley Moody c\o
52	John M. Guard, The Capitol, PL-01, Tallahassee, FL 32399-1050.
53	SECTION 6. All resolutions or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith be and the
54	same are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.
55	SECTION 7. If any clause, section, other part or application of this Resolution is
56	held by any court of competent jurisdiction to be unconstitutional or invalid, in part or
57	application, it shall not affect the validity of the remaining portions or applications of this
58	Resolution.
59	SECTION 8. Effective Date. This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon
60	its passage and adoption.
