On September, 6th 2019 the above referenced RLI was released. Questions from potential Proposers were accepted through October 16th, 2019. Responses were received on October 23rd, 2019 from a total of ten (10) vendors of which zero (0) were CBE/SBE:

The Selection Committee was comprised of the following:

- Captain Edward Sileo
- Major Daniel Jackowski
- Lt. Greg Molamphy

Proposals were forwarded to the S-C including information regarding any SBE/CBE firms. On November 6th, 2019, the Selection Committee met and shortlisted six (6) firms as follows:

- American Cyber
- ARES Security
- Brite Computers
- Convergent Technologies LLC
- IBM
- Motorola Solutions

Firms were invited to give an oral Presentation before the S-C on November 21st-22nd, 2019. On November 25th, 2019, the S-C reconvened and ranked firms in preferential order as follows:

1. Convergent Technologies LLC
2. Motorola Solutions
3. Brite Computers
4. IBM
5. American Cyber
6. ARES Security

On December 9th, 2019, Tanya Davis of S. Davis & Associates, P.A. provided a financial review of the top three (3) proposers Convergent Technologies LLC, Motorola Solutions, and Brite Computers. Based on the reviews and her opinion, there were no concerns that would impact ranking any of the three (3) vendors. Based on the financial review, the Section Committee unanimously agreed to retain their initial ranking of November 25th, 2019.

On December 10th, award was made to number one (1) ranked firm Convergent Technologies LLC. Negotiations Committee was created and comprised of:

On January 9th, 2020 a negotiations meeting was held in the Law Library with Convergent and the Negotiations Committee. Several items were discussed and the most important being the connection to a Motorola Premier One CAD which in their presentation claimed this integration was successfully completed. Convergent was unable to answer this item and several others. They planned to reconvene with their partnering company VidSys to get responses to the committees' questions.

On January 11th, 2020 Lee Futch had a conversation with Scott Frigaard of Convergent confirming that VidSys has not integrated a Motorola Premier One CAD and would give an integration status update along with the other items in a few days.

On January 15th, 2020 Convergent emailed Lee Futch the responses for the committee to review. A follow-up meeting was held on January 21st 2020 in the law library for the Negotiations Committee to discuss. As Convergent was not able to confirm it had successfully integrated to a Motorola Premier One CAD, a significant factor in the initial award to Convergent, it was determined by the Negotiation Committee to discontinue contract negotiations with Convergent and move to the number two (2) ranked firm, Motorola Solutions.

Recommendation to award number two ranked firm, Motorola Solutions and proceed to negotiations, if required and preparation of agreement. These services are:


