SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING UTILIZATION OF THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS ASSOCIATION (FSA) COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT TO PURCHASE REPLACEMENT HEAVY EQUIPMENT FOR FY2026 FROM DOBBS EQUIPMENT, LLC IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE HUNDRED, SIXTEEN THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-NINE DOLLARS (\$316,149); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

The purpose of this item is to request City Commission approval of a resolution authorizing the purchase of replacement heavy equipment for the Department of Public Works from Dobbs Equipment, LLC, utilizing the Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA) Cooperative Purchasing Agreement FSA23-EQU21.1, in an amount not to exceed \$316,149 and to execute all related documents to effectuate the purchase.

Background:

The Fleet Department has implemented a replacement plan that balances the cost of ownership with the operability of fleet assets, taking into account factors such as age, utilization, and anticipated surplus value on the secondary market. Based on this analysis, the equipment requested for replacement has been approved for FY26.

Current Situation:

Staff seeks to utilize the agreement between the Florida Sheriffs Association Cooperative Purchasing Agreement and Dobbs Equipment, LLC through FSA23-EQU21.1 Equipment. The initial term of the FSA Agreement ran from October 1, 2023, through September 30, 2025. On May 21, 2025, the first renewal period was exercised and provided a new expiration date of September 30, 2026.

The equipment requested to be purchased is critical to maintaining the City's utilities and streets infrastructure. These units have reached the end of their lifecycle, resulting in increased downtime and excessive repair costs. The following equipment below are scheduled to be replaced with this request:

1250	2016 Asphalt Roller/Compactor-Neighborhood Support and Response Team	\$64,707
1253	2016 Backhoe/Loader- Utilities Maintenance	\$188,217

Staff also seeks City Commissions authorization to dispose of all three assets listed above (Units 1005, 1250 and 1253) via a public auction. The estimated amount of proceeds to receive from the sale of each asset are unknown at this time but there is a possibility that one or more may receive more than \$20,000 at the auction and therefore require City Commission authorization to sell.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-5 Competitive procurement required: Procurement Mechanisms, (3) Cooperative Purchasing. Includes a variety of arrangements whereby two or more public entities have the opportunity to purchase from the same supplier or multiple suppliers using a single competitive procurement mechanism. Furthermore, Section 23-9, Award, (e) The City

Manager may award procurements within the delegated spending authority. All other procurements, except emergency procurements, require commission approval for award.

Cost Benefit:

The City of Hallandale Beach routinely leverages cooperative purchasing agreements to maximize cost efficiencies and realize savings that would otherwise be difficult for a municipality of our size to obtain independently. In alignment with this strategy, the City has elected to purchase the equipment listed from Dobbs Equipment, LLC utilizing Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA) cooperative purchasing agreement FSA23-EQU21.1. This approach ensures competitive pricing, streamlined procurement, and supports the timely acquisition of essential assets.
