SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING AWARD OF BID 25-26-04 CITYWIDE ADA COMPLIANT BUS STOPS TO M & M ASPHALT MAINTENANCE, INC. D/B/A ALL COUNTY PAVING, AS THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE AND RESPONSIBLE BIDDER, IN AN AMOUNT OF FOUR HUNDRED, EIGHTY-NINE THOUSAND, FOUR HUNDRED AND TWENTY-THREE DOLLARS AND SEVENTY-FIVE CENTS (\$489,423.75); AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

This agenda item seeks the City Commission's approval of staff's recommendation to award Bid 25-26-04 City Wide ADA Compliant Bus Stops (M2302) to M & M Asphalt Maintenance, Inc. dba All County Paving, as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, in an amount of \$489,423.75 plus a 10% contingency of \$48,942.37 for a total not to exceed the amount of \$538,366.12.

Background:

On June 7, 2023, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2023-054 (Exhibit 2) authorizing the use of the continuing service agreement to retain the services of The Corradino Group, Inc., to design and provide support services for the City Wide ADA Compliant Bus Stops Project in an amount not to exceed \$141,101, in accordance with RFP #2018-2019-012 – Continuing Professional Architectural and Engineering Services. The Corradino Group, Inc., submitted a design proposal to the Public Works Engineering Division on May 4, 2023 (Exhibit 3).

This project originated from the City's "Community Shuttle Routes Compliance, ADA-Compliant Bus Stops Master Plan" (Master Plan), which identified bus stop locations where improvements are being considered. During 2020 and 2021, County and City staff conducted field inspections of approximately 156 bus stop locations. These inspections determined that numerous community shuttle bus stop locations within the City of Hallandale Beach were not ADA compliant or functionally adequate. The results indicate a need for new ADA-compliant and functional bus stops to better support community shuttle services citywide. The project focuses on new installation of ADA Compliant Ramps to provide safe, independent access for all users, ensure compliance with ADA standards, and enhance pedestrian safety. A total of twenty-five (25) bus stops were selected for construction and are distributed across four City community shuttle routes.

Current Situation:

Release Date of Bid – November 20, 2025:

The release notice for the Bid was sent to over two thousand five hundred (2,500) vendors including vendors from the City's Vendor list and pertinent vendors that have a City Business Tax License to operate in the City.

Staff evaluated the responses and determined that M & M Asphalt Maintenance, Inc. dba All County Paving, is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder (Exhibit 4).

If approved by the City Commission, the construction contract will be finalized, and the estimated Project Schedule is as follows:

Commission Award	March 18, 2026
Anticipated Construction Start (Notice to Proceed)	May 18, 2026
Anticipated Construction Completion	December 17, 2026

Staff have reviewed the bids and the attached Award Information Memorandum (Exhibit 5). The Department of Public Works recommends awarding BID 25-26-04 City Wide ADA Compliant Bus Stops to M & M Asphalt Maintenance Inc. dba All County Paving (Exhibit 6).

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-5, Competitive procurement required, Procurement Mechanisms. (a) Except as otherwise indicated herein, all purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services in excess of the delegated spending authority, shall be based on a competitive procurement process. Furthermore, Section 23-9, Award, (e) The City Manager may award procurements within the delegated spending authority. All other procurements, except emergency procurements, require commission approval for award.

Cost Benefit:

The improvements at the twenty-five (25) locations will ensure ADA compliance. These enhancements support regulatory compliance, reduce risk, and improve accessibility. Implementing the ADA-compliant bus stops improvements is a strategically necessary investment that provides equitable access to transit and supports long-term operational efficiency.
