A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AWARDING BID # FY 2024-2025-22, SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS, TO WATERFIELD FLORIDA STAFFING, LLC, D/B/A ACTION LABOR OF FLORIDA, AS THE LOWEST RESPONSIVE BIDDER, IN THE NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT OF EIGHTY-THREE THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED AND THIRTY-FOUR DOLLARS (\$83,134) ANNUALLY, FOR A FIVE (5) YEAR PERIOD FROM FY 2025-26 THROUGH FY 2030-31; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

This agenda item seeks City Commission approval to award Bid # FY 2024-2025-22 – School Crossing Guard Services to Waterfield Florida Staffing LLC, dba Action Labor of Florida, as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder. The annual amount is

\$83,193.75 which provides a total contract amount of \$415,968.75 for a five-year term of service.

Background:

The current contract for these services is set to expire on September 30, 2025.

Current Situation:

On May 15th, 2025, the City issued an invitation to BID # FY 2024-2025-22, School Crossing Guards. The notice for the Bid was sent to over one hundred and ten (110) vendors including vendors from the City's Vendor list and pertinent vendors that have a City Business Tax License to operate in the City. The Bid was advertised through the Hallandale Beach Chamber of Commerce website, City's website, DEMANDSTAR.com and City and HBCRA Social Media pages. The Bid was also advertised through the Miami Minority Business Development Agency Business Center, the U.S. Small Business Administration, and the Broward County Community Relations and Outreach Section Office of Economic and Small Business Development.

On May 27th, 2025, at 10:00 am, a Non-Mandatory Pre-Bid meeting was held. One (1) firm attended the pre-bid meeting.

The Bid was due on June 23rd, 2025, and five (5) vendors responded to the solicitation.

Staff evaluated the responses and determined that Waterfield Florida Staffing LLC, dba Action Labor of Florida, is the responsive and lowest bidder in the final tabulated amount of \$415,968.75 (or \$83,193.75 annually).

Staff seeks approval to enter into a contract for school crossing guard services in designated school zones throughout the City for a period of five (5) years.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-4, Competitive bidding required, all purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services, when the estimated cost shall exceed \$50,000.00 shall be based on competitive bids. Furthermore, Section 23-6, Award of contract, the City Manager, shall have the authority to recommend to the City Commission award of contracts.

Cost Benefit:

Bid # FY 2024-2025-22 for School Crossing Guard Services ensures the most competitive pricing for the city. Funding for these services has been budgeted in Fiscal Year 2025–2026.
