A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, RATIFYING GRANT APPLICATIONS TO THE HAZARD MITIGATION GRANT PROGRAM (HMGP) TO SUPPORT THE DEVELOPMENT OF A CITYWIDE STORMWATER MASTER PLAN, AND TO BROWARD COUNTY UNDER THE SECTION 219 PROGRAM TO SUPPORT THE NORTHEAST DRAINAGE INFRASTRUCTURE IMPROVEMENTS PROJECT; AUTHORIZING ACCEPTANCE AND EXECUTION OF GRANT AWARDS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

This item seeks City Commission approval to ratify the applications and accept potential grant awards that may result from two grant applications.

The City has submitted two grant applications to support stormwater planning and drainage infrastructure improvements. The first application is through the Hazard

Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP), administered by the Federal Emergency Management Agency through the Florida Division of Emergency Management, requesting \$300,000 to support the development of a Citywide Stormwater Master Plan. The plan will evaluate existing stormwater infrastructure, identify flood-prone areas, and recommend capital improvement projects to reduce flood risk and enhance system resilience.

The second application was submitted through Broward County under the Section 219 Program, requesting \$5,000,000 to support the Northeast Drainage Infrastructure Improvements project. This project proposes the construction of two stormwater pump stations to improve drainage capacity and reduce flooding within the northeast quadrant of the City. If awarded, these funding opportunities would support the City's ongoing efforts to improve stormwater infrastructure and strengthen community resilience to flooding.

Background:

These grant opportunities were announced after the City's Annual Grants Matrix was approved on September 29, 2025 via Resolution No. 2025-122, and were not included as part of the identified list of funding opportunities that the City could pursue during the fiscal year. Once the City's staff was notified about the availability of these funding programs, the City's Grants Division, in cooperation with the Department of Public Works, prepared and submitted the application to pursue these opportunities.

The first application was submitted to the Hazard Mitigation Grant Program (HMGP) to obtain funding for the development of the Citywide Stormwater Master Plan. The second application was submitted through Broward County under the Section 219 Program to obtain funding for the Northeast Drainage Infrastructure Improvements project, which includes the construction of two stormwater pump stations. The City's Section 219 project was the highest scoring project during the evaluation process by the County. Broward County has since submitted the City's proposal to the Office of Congresswoman Debbie Wasserman Schultz to be included in the Federal Appropriations Process that must be approved by Congress.

Current Situation:

Both grant opportunities require a local match that exceeds the City Manager's delegated spending authority. Therefore, in preparation for potential awards, these items must be brought before the City Commission for authorization to accept the grant awards and to appropriate the required matching funds. Approval of this resolution will allow the City to move forward by accepting the awards should either application be selected for funding and ensure the City is prepared to meet the required match obligations.

Both grant opportunities require a local match. The HMGP application requests up to \$300,000 and requires a 25% local match of up to \$100,000, to be funded from the Stormwater Fund. The Section 219 Program requires a 25% local match based on the final award amount, which will be funded through the Utility Bond Tranche 2024.

Why Action is Necessary:
