ORDINANCE NO. 2026 -**

**AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF
THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AMENDING
THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH CODE OF
ORDINANCES, CHAPTER 19 – OFFENSES AND
MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS, ARTICLE I. – IN GENERAL,
BY ADDING SECTION 19-24, SPEED DETECTION SYSTEMS
FOR THE ENFORCEMENT OF SCHOOL ZONE SPEED LIMITS;
PROVIDING FOR CONFLICT; PROVIDING FOR
SEVERABILITY; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

WHEREAS, pursuant to Article V, Division I, Section 5.01 of the City of Hallandale Beach Charter, a City ordinance is required to amend an existing ordinance; and

WHEREAS, the Florida Legislature passed amended certain provisions of state law governing the use of automated Speed Detection Systems (“SDS”) in School Zones, which was codified in Sections 316.003, 316.008, and 316.0776, Florida Statutes; and

WHEREAS, speeding in designated school zones presents a threat to the health and safety of the public, and in particular, all school aged children who attend schools in the City; and

WHEREAS, a traffic study was conducted during the week of November 14, 2025, to November 20, 2025, at the following school zones:

1. Gulfstream Academy (North and South in the 200-500 blk of SW 8th Ave.)
2. Gulfstream Academy/Hallandale High School (East and West in the 700-1000 blk of W. Hallandale Beach Blvd)
3. Hallandale High School (East and West in the 700-900 blk of Foster Rd)
4. Hallandale High School (East in the 800-1000 blk of W. Pembroke Rd)
5. Lanier James/Hallandale High School (North and South in the 500-900 blk of Ansin Blvd)

WHEREAS, the traffic study documented the zones as areas with a speeding issue, collectively having approximately a third of all cars speeding. During the morning hours, the combined traffic was 12,025 vehicles, to which 3,714 were speeding at or above 11 MPHs above the posted speed limit. Similar data showed during the afternoon hours the combined traffic was 8,260 vehicles, to which 3,616 were speeding; and

WHEREAS, consistent with the requirements of section 316.008(9)(c), Florida Statutes, in consideration of creating a speed detection system, the City held a public hearing on April 15, 2026, at which traffic data demonstrated a significant safety need for traffic infraction detectors; and

WHEREAS, the City of Hallandale Beach desires to implement an automated SDS program in school zones in order to reduce speeding and benefit public safety; and

WHEREAS, Staff recommends that the Mayor and City Commission find it to be in the public interest to amend the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances, Chapter 19 – Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article I. – In General, by adding Section 19-24, Speed Detection Systems for the Enforcement of School Zone Speed Limits, as set forth below.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are confirmed as true and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Based on the evidence presented, the Mayor and City Commission of the City of Hallandale Beach hereby find that speeding in the school zones identified herein constitutes a heightened safety risk that warrants additional enforcement measures pursuant to state statute.

SECTION 3. Chapter 19 – Offenses and Miscellaneous Provisions, Article I. – In General, of the City of Hallandale Beach Code Ordinances, is hereby amended to add the following Section 19-24 – “Speed Detection Systems for the Enforcement of School Zone Speed Limits:”

Section 19-24, Speed Detection Systems for Enforcement of School Zone Speed Limits

(a) Purpose and Intent. The purpose of this Section is to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the citizens and visitors of the City of Hallandale Beach by authorizing the placement or installation and use of speed detection systems on roadways within the jurisdiction of the City in order to promote compliance with speed limits in school zones, as authorized by and in accordance with Chapter 316, Florida Statutes, as may be amended from time to time. This Section is also intended to provide a supplemental means of enforcing unlawful speed violations in school zones and shall not prohibit a law enforcement officer from issuing a uniform traffic citation for a traffic violation in accordance with Chapter 316, Florida Statutes.

(b) Use of Speed Detection Systems. In accordance with Chapter 316, Florida Statutes, after review of evidence at a public hearing, the school zones on the roadways indicated below constitute a heightened safety risk that warrants additional enforcement measures by installation or placement of Speed Detection Systems pursuant to F.S. § 316.008, The City authorizes installation of speed detection systems to enforce applicable speed limits on roadways maintained as school zones within the City of Hallandale Beach's jurisdiction at the following locations:

- (1) Gulfstream Academy (North and South in the 200-500 blk of SW 8th Ave.)
- (2) Gulfstream Academy/Hallandale High School (East and West in the 700-1000 blk of W. Hallandale Beach Blvd)
- (3) Hallandale High School (East and West in the 700-900 blk of Foster Rd)
- (4) Hallandale High School (East in the 800-1000 blk of W. Pembroke Rd)
- (5) Lanier James/Hallandale High School (North and South in the 500-900 blk of Ansin Blvd)

- 106 (c) Program Administration.
- 107 (1) The Police Department in cooperation with any necessary City staff
108 and any approved vendor and its employees and agents, shall be
109 enabled and empowered by this section to administer the City's school
110 zone speed enforcement program. The City may enter into
111 agreements with one (1) or more vendors to place or install speed
112 detection systems and carry out services in accordance with the
113 provisions of this Code and Florida State Statutes.
- 114 (2) Traffic Infraction Enforcement Officers. Pursuant to Section 316.1896
115 Florida Statutes, a traffic infraction enforcement officer under Section
116 316.640 Florida Statutes is authorized to issue a uniform traffic
117 citation(s) for violations of Sections 316.1895 and 316.183, Florida
118 Statutes, as authorized by 316.008(9) Florida Statutes.
- 119 (3) Designation of Local Hearing Officers. The individual designated as
120 the City of Hallandale Beach Parking Enforcement Hearing Officer is
121 hereby designated to conduct hearings requested by alleged violators
122 wishing to contest notices of violation in accordance with the
123 requirements of notice and hearings in Ch. 316, Florida Statutes, as
124 may be amended.
- 125 (4) Fines and fees shall be in accordance with Ch. 316, Florida Statutes,
126 as may be amended.
- 127 (d) Signage and Public Awareness Campaign. The City Commission shall cause
128 to be posted signage and conduct an initial public awareness campaign
129 regarding the placement or installation of speed detection systems consistent
130 with the applicable requirements of Chapter 316, Florida Statutes and all
131 applicable regulations of the state.
- 132 (e) Remittance of collected fines and costs. All fines and costs collected pursuant
133 to this Section will be remitted in accordance with Sections 316.1896 and
134 318.18, Florida Statutes, and any other relevant State law.

136 **SECTION 3. Conflict.** All ordinances, parts of ordinances, resolutions, or parts of
137 resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict.

139 **SECTION 4. Severability.** Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared by a
140 court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this
141 Ordinance as a whole or any portion thereof, other than the part that is declared to be invalid.

143 **SECTION 5. Effective Date.** This Ordinance shall take effect ten (10) days after its
144 adoption.
