A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING UTILIZATION OF THE FLORIDA SHERIFFS ASSOCIATION (FSA) COOPERATIVE PURCHASING AGREEMENT TO PURCHASE REPLACEMENT HEAVY EQUIPMENT FOR FY2026 FROM DOBBS EQUIPMENT, LLC IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED THREE HUNDRED, SIXTEEN THOUSAND, ONE HUNDRED AND FORTY-NINE DOLLARS (\$316,149); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

17 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances,
18 Section 23-5, Competitive procurement required, procurement mechanisms (a), all
19 purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services in excess
20 of the delegated spending authority shall be based on a competitive procurement
21 process; and

23 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances,
24 Section 23-9, Award, (e), the City Manager may award procurements within the
25 delegated spending authority, and all other procurements, except emergency
26 procurements, require commission approval for award; and

27
28 **WHEREAS**, pursuant to the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances,
29 Section 23-5 Competitive procurement required; procurement mechanisms,
30 Subsection (3) Cooperative purchasing, the City may procure goods or services
31 through a variety of arrangements whereby two or more public entities have the
32 opportunity to purchase from the same supplier or multiple suppliers using a single
33 competitive procurement mechanism, and Subsection (4) Piggybacking, the City
34 may procure goods or services from vendors who have been selected as a result of
35 a competitive selection process by another governmental entity if the selection
36 process utilized by the contracting entity was substantially similar to the
37 requirements of the City, and the goods or services procured by the City are
38 procured pursuant to the original contract scope and terms; and

40 **WHEREAS**, the City of Hallandale Beach Fleet Department implemented a
41 replacement plan for heavy equipment critical to maintain the City’s utilities and street
42 infrastructure that balances the cost of ownership with the operability of fleet assets,
43 taking into account factors such as age, utilization, and anticipated surplus value on
44 the secondary market; and

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46 **WHEREAS**, Staff has identified needed replacement of heavy equipment for
47 FY2026 in an amount not to exceed Three Hundred, Sixteen Thousand, One Hundred
48 and Forty-Nine Dollars (\$316,149); and

50 **WHEREAS**, Staff recommends that the Mayor and City Commission find it to
51 be in the public interest to authorize utilization of the Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA)
52 Cooperative Purchasing Agreement FSA23-EQU21.1 to purchase replacement heavy
53 equipment for FY2026 from Dobbs Equipment, LLC in an amount not to exceed Three
54 Hundred, Sixteen Thousand, One Hundred and Forty-Nine Dollars (\$316,149), and
55 authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

57 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY**
58 **COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

60 **SECTION 1.** The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are incorporated herein.

62 **SECTION 2. City Manager Authorization.** The Mayor and City Commission
63 hereby authorize utilization of the Florida Sheriffs Association (FSA) Cooperative
64 Purchasing Agreement FSA23-EQU21.1 to purchase replacement heavy equipment
65 for FY2026 from Dobbs Equipment, LLC in an amount not to exceed Three Hundred,
66 Sixteen Thousand, One Hundred and Forty-Nine Dollars (\$316,149), and authorize
67 the City Manager to execute relating documents.

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70 **SECTION 3. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect
71 immediately upon its passage and adoption.
