**BOARD/COMMITTEE DESCRIPTION**

The Quadrant Safety Board (QSB) represents an innovative, community-focused policing model that empowers appointed stakeholders, residents, and business operators within each CRA quadrant to actively contribute to developing and implementing safety initiatives tailored to their communities.

Convening monthly under the guidance of a designated police liaison, the QSB serves as a structured forum for identifying concerns, discussing strategies, and advancing solutions to neighborhood-specific public safety issues. Comprised of five members appointed by the HBCRA Board of Directors, the QSB reflects a diverse cross-section of individuals who are deeply invested in the safety and well-being of their communities.

Through sustained collaboration and engagement, the QSB strengthens the partnership between the Hallandale Beach Police Department and the community, fostering transparency, mutual understanding, and trust while proactively addressing challenges affecting the City.

## ACTIVITIES/ACCOMPLISHMENTS

Over the past year, the QSB has convened monthly to review statistical data and address critical public safety initiatives across the HBCRA's four quadrants. These meetings have covered a broad range of topics, including illegal dumping, City Code compliance, and trends in violent crime.

The Board has also evaluated the effectiveness of key policing strategies and technologies, such as License Plate Readers, the "ShotSpotter" gunshot detection system, drone deployment, and parking enforcement efforts. In addition, members have explored neighborhood enhancement initiatives, leveraging strong community relationships to gather input and help inform data-driven decision-making.

Collectively, these ongoing discussions have fostered enhanced collaboration, transparency, and trust among law enforcement, QSB Board members, and community stakeholders.

## PRIORITY ACTIVITIES

Achieving quorum continues to present a significant challenge at monthly meetings. The HBCRA Quadrant Safety Board comprises five designated positions, four of which are currently filled, with one remaining vacant. During recent discussions, members emphasized the importance of filling the vacancy to improve the consistency of achieving a quorum.

Board members have also taken a proactive approach to raising community awareness of this opportunity, encouraging residents to engage and contribute directly to the City's problem-solving and public safety efforts.

## BOARD/COMMITTEE RECOMMENDATIONS

The Board recommended hosting an annual retreat or workshop to review goals, evaluate outcomes, and establish strategic priorities for the upcoming year.
