4 A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND COMMISSION OF THE
5 CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING A
6 FY 2025-26 ILA BETWEEN THE CITY OF HALLANDALE
7 BEACH AND THE HBCRA TO FUND COMMUNITY POLICING
8 INNOVATIONS TOTALING TWO MILLION, TWENTY-NINE
9 THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-FOUR
10 DOLLARS (\$2,029,784); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE
11 DATE.

13 **WHEREAS**, Section 163.01 and 163.400, Fla. Stats. require that the financial
14 relationships between cities and community redevelopment agencies (CRAs) be set forth in
15 interlocal agreements (ILAs) documenting the services the City will provide to the CRA and
16 establishing compensation for such services; and
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18 **WHEREAS**, the HBCRA funds ongoing community policing innovation initiatives in
19 accordance with Part III of Chapter 163, Florida Statutes. The goal is to reduce crime within
20 the CRA by, among other strategies, minimizing opportunities for criminal activity, increasing
21 the perceived risk of committing crimes through a visible police presence, fostering positive
22 community-police interactions, equipping residents with tools to protect themselves, and
23 encouraging redevelopment and investment within the CRA; and

25 **WHEREAS**, the 2024-25 ILA between the Hallandale Beach Community
26 Redevelopment Agency (HBCRA) and the City of Hallandale Beach (COHB) allocated Two
27 Million, One Hundred, Twenty Thousand, Nine Hundred and Forty-One Dollars (\$2,120,941)
28 for community policing innovations to be implemented by the Hallandale Beach Police
29 Department, providing funding for the Strategic Intelligence Unit (SIU), the Community
30 Relations Specialist (CRS), and the Quadrant Safety Board (QSB), which initiatives promote
31 positive interactions between the community and the police, significantly aiding law
32 enforcement in their crime-fighting efforts and strengthening the work of the Quadrant Safety
33 Board; and

35 **WHEREAS**, Staff recommends that the Mayor and City Commission find it to be in the
36 public interest to authorize a FY 2025-26 ILA between the City of Hallandale Beach and the
37 HBCRA to fund community policing innovations totaling Two Million, Twenty-Nine Thousand,
38 Seven Hundred and Eighty-Four Dollars (\$2,029,784), to support the Police Department's
39 Strategic Intelligence Unit (SIU), Community Relations Specialist (CRS), additional license
40 plate reader (LPR) cameras, public safety (CCTV) cameras, and the Quadrant Safety Board
41 (QSB), and authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

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43 **NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE MAYOR AND THE CITY**
44 **COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:**

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46 **SECTION 1. Recitals.** The foregoing "Whereas" clauses are incorporated herein.

47 **SECTION 2. Approval of Interlocal Agreement.** The City Commission hereby
48 authorizes a FY 2025-26 ILA between the City of Hallandale Beach and the HBCRA to fund
49 community policing innovations totaling Two Million, Twenty-Nine Thousand, Seven Hundred
50 and Eighty-Four Dollars (\$2,029,784), to support the Police Department's Strategic
51 Intelligence Unit (SIU), Community Relations Specialist (CRS), additional license plate reader
52 (LPR) cameras, public safety (CCTV) cameras, and the Quadrant Safety Board (QSB), and
53 authorize the City Manager to execute relating documents.

55 **SECTION 3. Execution of Interlocal Agreement.** The City Manager is hereby
56 authorized to execute the Interlocal Agreement.

57 **SECTION 4. Implementation of Interlocal Agreement.** The City Manager is hereby
58 authorized to take all steps necessary and appropriate to implement the terms and conditions
59 of the Interlocal Agreement.

60 **Section 5. Effective Date.** This Resolution shall take effect immediately upon
61 approval.
