SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING UTILIZATION OF SOURCEWELL CONTRACT TO PURCHASE FROM JET-VAC EQUIPMENT COMPANY, LLC. REPLACEMENT SEWER INSPECTION CAMERA TRUCK IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FOUR HUNDRED AND ONE THOUSAND, EIGHT HUNDRED AND EIGHTY-NINE DOLLARS (\$401,889); AUTHORIZING DISPOSAL OF THE REPLACED VEHICLE IN ACCORDANCE WITH THE CITY'S SURPLUS PROPERTY POLICIES AND APPLICABLE LAWS; AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

The purpose of this agenda item is to request approval from the City Commission for the attached resolution authorizing the purchase of a sewer camera inspection truck from Jet-Vac Equipment Company, LLC. through Sourcewell Contract 120721-RVL, in an amount not to exceed \$401,889. The resolution further authorizes the appropriate City officials to execute all related documents necessary to effectuate the purchase this vehicle and to dispose of the replaced vehicle in accordance with the City's surplus property policies and applicable laws.

Background:

The Fleet Department has implemented a strategic replacement plan designed to balance total cost of ownership with the operational reliability of fleet assets. This plan evaluates key factors including vehicle age, utilization rates, maintenance history, and anticipated surplus value in the secondary market. Based on this comprehensive analysis, the vehicle requested for replacement has been approved for FY26.

As part of the FY26 replacement plan, Unit 1218 a 2015 Ford E-450 sewer inspection camera truck has been recommended for replacement. The chassis is now over 10 years old and is approaching the end of its reliable service life. In addition to age-related concerns, significant technological advancements in sewer inspection equipment provide a strong justification for replacement.

The proposed unit will deliver high-resolution video and imaging capabilities, along with the ability to add real-time annotations during inspections. It will also include GIS integration with sonar-based location tracking, greatly enhancing the accuracy and efficiency of asset mapping and condition assessment.

Investing in a replacement sewer camera inspection truck is essential to maintaining proactive infrastructure management, minimizing costly emergency repairs, ensuring regulatory compliance, and supporting data-driven capital planning resulting in measurable long-term savings and increased system reliability.

Current Situation:

Staff seeks to utilize the agreement between Sourcewell and Rapid View, LLC (Underground Infrastructure Inspection and Rehabilitation Equipment with Related Services) No.: 120721-RVL. The initial term of the Sourcewell contract ran from January 13, 2022, through January 17, 2026. On November 11, 2025, the first renewal period was exercised and provided a new expiration date of January 17, 2027. Rapid View, LLC selected Jet-Vac Equipment Company, LLC. to conduct business in the State of Florida. Sourcewell, a municipal contracting agency, allows government entities to cooperatively procure equipment and services at discounted rates. By leveraging Sourcewell's cooperative pricing, the City ensures competitive costs and streamlined procurement, enabling staff to respond quickly and effectively to emerging needs.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-5 Competitive procurement required; Procurement Mechanisms, (3) Cooperative Purchasing. Includes a variety of arrangements whereby two or more public entities have the opportunity to purchase from the same supplier or multiple suppliers using a single competitive procurement mechanism. Furthermore, Section 23-9, Award, (e) The City Manager may award procurements within the

delegated spending authority. All other procurements, except emergency procurements, require commission approval for award.

Cost Benefit:

The City of Hallandale Beach routinely leverages cooperative purchasing agreements to maximize cost efficiencies and realize savings that would otherwise be difficult for a municipality of our size to obtain independently. In alignment with this strategy, the City has elected to purchase this vehicle from Jet-Vac Equipment Company, LLC. utilizing Sourcewell cooperative Contract # 120721-RVL. This approach ensures competitive pricing, streamlined procurement, and supports the timely acquisition of essential public safety assets.

Replacing specialized assets such as a sewer camera inspection truck on a timely, lifecycle-based schedule provides significant operational and financial benefits by minimizing total cost of ownership rather than simply deferring capital expenditures. Unlike standard fleet vehicles, sewer inspection trucks integrate advanced camera, recording, and locating technologies that are critical to maintaining wastewater infrastructure. As both the chassis and inspection equipment age, maintenance and repair costs increase nonlinearly, system downtime becomes more frequent, and inspection capabilities become limited or obsolete resulting in reduced productivity, delayed condition assessments, and increased risk of undetected system failures.

Modern sewer camera systems offer substantial advancements, including high-resolution imaging, real-time defect annotation, GIS integration, and sonar-based location tracking. These features enable more accurate condition assessments, improve data collection, and support proactive maintenance strategies. Without reliable and up-to-date inspection equipment, utilities are more likely to rely on reactive repairs, which are significantly more costly and disruptive.
