ORDINANCE NO. 2025-

AN ORDINANCE OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA,
AMENDING CHAPTER 2, ARTICLE IV – “DEPARTMENTS”
TO CREATE SECTION CODIFY EXISTING DEPARTMENTS
AND CORRECT NAMING CONVENTIONS; ENACTING
SECTION 2-342 CREATING THE TRANSPORTATION AND
MOBILITY DEPARTMENT; PROVIDING FOR SEVERABILITY;
PROVIDING FOR CONFLICTS; PROVIDING FOR
CODIFICATION; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE
DATE.

WHEREAS, pursuant to Section 5.01(4)(a) of the City Charter, City departments may
only be established, altered or abolished by ordinance; and

WHEREAS, while existing departments may have been established by ordinance, the
failure to centrally codify their creation makes it much more difficult and time consuming to verify
compliance with the Charter; and

WHEREAS, codifying the existing departments by ordinance and correcting naming
conventions will ensure full compliance with the Charter and maximum transparency for the
public; and

WHEREAS, Staff further recommends the creation of a new department, the
Transportation and Mobility Department; and

WHEREAS, the Transportation and Mobility (TAM) Division currently exists within the
Department of Sustainable Development (DSD) and is responsible for managing a wide range
of critical transportation and mobility initiatives, including the introduction of electric buses,
the development of micro-transit and bike services, transportation infrastructure
improvements, and strategic planning efforts; and

WHEREAS, Hallandale Beach continues to grow and face significant challenges related
to traffic congestion, which consistently ranks as one of the top complaints from residents, and

it has become clear that the City requires a dedicated, stand-alone department focused entirely on transportation and mobility; and

WHEREAS, the growing demand for these services, combined with the City's long-term goals of improving mobility, reducing traffic congestion, and ensuring sustainability, necessitates the elevation of TAM to its own independent department. This department will allow for a more concentrated focus, dedicated resources, and the necessary leadership to address the City's pressing transportation challenges; and

WHEREAS, among other responsibilities as necessary, the main areas of concern for the department will be:

- Electric bus service
- Micro-transit and bike services
- Transportation Plans: Transportation Master Plan, Comprehensive Plan Transportation Element, Mobility Road Map, Basis of Design Report (BORD), etc.
- Grant opportunities for transportation projects
- Transportation and mobility projects for the City's Capital Improvement Plan
- Partnerships with various intergovernmental entities such as the Broward Metropolitan Planning Organization (BMPO), Broward County, Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT), Federal Transit Authority (FTA), South Florida Regional Transit Authority (SFRTA), and more
- Infrastructure improvements such as complete streets improvement projects, sidewalks, crosswalks, bus stop ADA compliance, bus shelter improvement and maintenance, in collaboration with the Department of Public Works
- Ridership enhancement strategies for the Cloud network.
- Traffic calming strategies
- Performance measures and evaluation of programs

WHEREAS, the Mayor and City Commission recognize that the proposed amendments will accommodate continued efforts to enhance and revitalize the City and will improve the overall quality of life for citizens and residents of the City.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION
OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA:

SECTION 1. **Incorporation of Recitals.** The foregoing “Whereas” clauses are
confirmed as true and incorporated herein.

SECTION 2. Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 1 of the City of Hallandale Beach Code
of Ordinances is hereby amended as follows:

Chapter 2 – ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE IV. – OFFICES AND DEPARTMENTS

DIVISION 1. - GENERALLY

Secs. 2-321- Departments Authorized.

(a) In addition to the offices mandated by the City Charter, the City shall maintain
the following departments:

- (1) Budget and Program Monitoring
- (2) Finance
- (3) Fire
- (4) Human Resources
- (5) Human Services
- (6) Innovation Technology
- (7) Parks, Recreation, and Open Spaces
- (8) Police
- (9) Procurement
- (10) Public Works
- (11) Sustainable Development
- (12) Transportation and Mobility

(b) The head of each department shall report to the City Manager, or his designee,
and shall be designated as a director. Duties and responsibilities shall include those
stipulated elsewhere in this City Code, by ordinance or resolution, or as otherwise
directed by the City Manager.

Secs. 2-3224 —2-340. - Reserved.

SECTION 3. Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 2 of the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby renamed and amended as follows:

Chapter 2 – ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE IV. – DEPARTMENTS

DIVISION 2. – SPECIFIC DEPARTMENTS ~~HUMAN SERVICES DEPARTMENT~~

Sec. 2-341. – Human Services Department. ~~Established; director; purpose and functions.~~

There is created a department to be named and known as the human services department. The head of such department shall be designated as the director. The purposes and functions of the human services department and the director shall include the purposes and functions heretofore performed by the department of social services and its director.

Sec. 2-342. – Transportation and Mobility Department

There is created a department to be named and known as the Transportation and Mobility Department. The department shall be responsible for managing transportation and mobility initiatives, the development of transportation infrastructure improvements, and strategic planning efforts to address transportation challenges.

SECTION 4. Chapter 2, Article IV, Division 3, “Legal Department,” of the City of Hallandale Beach Code of Ordinances is hereby renamed and amended as follows:

DIVISION 3 – CITY ATTORNEY ~~LEGAL DEPARTMENT~~

Sec. 2-363. - Compensation of personnel.

The compensation of the city attorney and all other personnel of the city attorney’s office ~~legal department~~ shall be fixed by the commission in the annual budget. It shall be paid by the city in the same manner as salaries of other city employees are paid. Funds budgeted for unfilled positions may be utilized for temporary services or reallocated to other positions as necessary.

SECTION 5. Conflict. All ordinances, parts of ordinances, resolutions, or parts of resolutions in conflict herewith are hereby repealed, to the extent of the conflict.

SECTION 6. Severability. Should any provision of this Ordinance be declared by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, such decision shall not affect the validity of this Ordinance as a whole or any portion thereof, other than the part that is declared to be invalid.

SECTION 7. Codification. It is the intention of the Mayor and City Commission that the provisions of this ordinance be incorporated into the Code of Ordinances; to effect such intention the words "ordinance" or "section" may be changed to other appropriate words.

SECTION 8. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect immediately upon its passage and adoption.
