17	WHEREAS, while existing departments may have been established by ordinance, the
18	failure to centrally codify their creation makes it much more difficult and time consuming to verify
19	compliance with the Charter; and
20	WHEREAS, codifying the existing departments by ordinance and correcting naming
21	conventions will ensure full compliance with the Charter and maximum transparency for the
	·
22	public; and
23	WHEREAS, Staff further recommends the creation of a new department, the
24	Transportation and Mobility Department; and
25	WHEREAS, the Transportation and Mobility (TAM) Division currently exists within the
26	Department of Sustainable Development (DSD) and is responsible for managing a wide range
27	of critical transportation and mobility initiatives, including the introduction of electric buses,
28	the development of micro-transit and bike services, transportation infrastructure
29	improvements, and strategic planning efforts; and
30	WHEREAS, Hallandale Beach continues to grow and face significant challenges related

to traffic congestion, which consistently ranks as one of the top complaints from residents, and

32	it has become clear	that the City requires a dedicated, stand-alone department focused entirely	
33	on transportation ar	nd mobility; and	
34	WHEREAS,	the growing demand for these services, combined with the City's long-	
35	term goals of impi	roving mobility, reducing traffic congestion, and ensuring sustainability,	
36	necessitates the el	evation of TAM to its own independent department. This department will
