SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA AUTHORIZING PURCHASE OF EIGHT (8) NEW MOTOROLA APX RADIOS FOR BEACH SAFETY FOR A NOT TO EXCEED AMOUNT OF NINETY-EIGHT THOUSAND, TWO HUNDRED, FIFTY-ONE DOLLARS AND THIRTY CENTS (\$98,251.30); AND PROVIDING AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

Staff seek approval to proceed with a purchase agreement with Motorola Solutions to replace all existing Beach Safety radios, in the best interest of the City. The proposed agreement includes the acquisition of eight (8) new Motorola APX Radios. These radios are fully compatible with the County's existing radio communication system ensuring seamless coordination and enhanced communication capabilities across law enforcement agencies.

The purchase agreement encompasses the radios, chargers, programming, and warranty coverage provided by Motorola Solutions, which includes Public Safety Software Services, accidental damage insurance, and seven years of Smart Features and Central Services. The total cost of the purchase is \$98,251.31.

Background:

Beach Safety has previously purchased refurbished radios for their emergency communication needs. The current radios are due for replacement.

Current Situation:

The current Beach Safety radios are obsolete, and their operating system will no longer be supported by Motorola. In addition, due to advancements in technology, Motorola will cease providing spare parts for these radios after 2026, making future repairs increasingly difficult or impossible. Refurbished radios are no longer an option for Beach Safety needs. The new Motorola APX radios offer enhanced smart features, including LTE wireless communication and advanced information-sharing capabilities.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-10, Exception to competitive solicitation requirements, (4) Best interest of city, Where the city commission declares by majority vote that the process of competitive solicitations is not in the best interest of the city and the reasons therefore, for example, if the City elects to conduct a limited time pilot to test the viability and impacts of a program, or ratification of expenditures made contrary to the requirements stated herein.

Cost Benefit:

By entering into this Purchase Agreement, the City will receive a Purchase Incentive Discount of \$1,152 and receive a NASPO Contract Discounted Pricing of \$98,251.30.

PROPOSED ACTION:

The City Commission approves the proposed Resolution.
