SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH. FLORIDA. OF 51ST AUTHORIZE FILING YEAR COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT BLOCK GRANT APPLICATIONS FOR AFTERSCHOOL TUTORIAL PROGRAM IN THE AMOUNT OF ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$100,000) TO AND **WORKS** SW QUADRANT **PUBLIC DRAINAGE** IMPROVEMENTS IN THE AMOUNT OF THREE HUNDRED AND NINETEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$319,000); AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

STAFF SUMMARY:

Summary:

Staff seeks authorization to submit Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) applications for the 51st Year of funding in Fiscal Year 2025/2026, accept grant awards, and execute any and all grant documents.

Background:

The Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) by the U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development, is a program that provides communities with resources to address a wide range of community development needs.

Cities participating in the Broward County CDBG program receive an allocation based on a U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) funding formula. This formula takes into consideration community housing conditions, population, and poverty indicators. The funding allocation is automatic and non-competitive, as long as the allocation is for HUD/CDBG-eligible activities (which may include capital, economic development, and housing and public service projects). Although the allocation is non-competitive, cities must still apply to receive funding. The City of Hallandale Beach applies for CDBG funds annually.

Current Situation:

Per the CDBG Program requirements, two public meetings must be held. Staff will conduct advertised public meetings in order to receive public comments from residents about the City's proposed projects and also to gather information from the public as to projects that the community would like to see implemented.

The public meeting was held on Thursday, February 6, 2025, at 6 p.m. (*Exhibit 2*). During the public meeting, residents were informed of the City's plan to continue the Afterschool Tutorial Enrichment Program at the Hepburn Center; and to implement infrastructure upgrades. This meeting also alerted residents to the fact that the City Commission will be considering this agenda item at the March 19, 2025, meeting and invite them to attend and to make follow-up comments. This Commission Meeting is considered the second required public meeting for the purpose of this grant.

Grant applications are recommended for the following two (2) projects (Awaiting application Release from the County. Application amount subject to change, based on the County's available allocation per City.):

1. Afterschool Tutorial Program

\$100,000

The Afterschool Tutorial Enrichment Program proposes to serve a minimum of 175 low to moderate income students. The program is also referred to as limited clientele per HUD national objectives. The CDBG grant has allowed the City to enhance public services for the Afterschool Tutorial Enrichment Program, and to serve a minimum of 175 limited clientele students. The total request is \$100,000. Matching contributions include both cash and in-kind donations, e.g., utilization of seven classrooms, vans, classroom furniture, the value of volunteer services as well as a portion of both direct and indirect staff salaries for a total match of \$1,039,824. The total program value is \$1,139,824.

2. Public Works Drainage Improvements

\$319,000

Public Works Improvements in the SW Quadrant will include drainage, sidewalks, regrading and sodding of swales and other related infrastructure improvements along SW 7th Terrace between SW 9th Street and SW 11th Street. Other CDBG eligible areas may be added in the design process, depending on the Community's input during the public meetings. Total project cost is estimated to be \$382,344 (\$63,344 Design Maximum Budget and \$319,000 Construction Budget). Should the design fees or the bid process be lower than the estimate, the remaining balance will be available for additional drainage improvements.

The total grant request for the two projects is \$419.000. Grant funds are requested to supplement and enhance City programs and projects. The cost breakdown for each project is included in each grant application. Local matching funds are not required; however, program or project costs in excess of CDBG funding will be provided by the City and other sources as follows:

If approved, CDBG funding will become available during Fiscal Year 2025/2026 and will be appropriated in Fund 150 (Afterschool Tutorial Program) and Fund 440 (Drainage Improvements Project) respectively.

Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Article V, Section 5.01, of the City of Hallandale Beach Charter, Resolutions are to be presented to and adopted by a majority of the Commission. Furthermore, per Broward County and the CDBG program guidelines, a resolution of the City Commission authorizing the grant applications is required.

Cost Benefit:

The City leverages various funding sources to enhance services and projects through grant funding. The CDBG grant will offset costs in the General Fund and Stormwater Fund in the amount of approximately \$419.000.
