**SHORT TITLE:**

**A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AUTHORIZING UTILIZATION OF THE COOPERATIVE AGREEMENT BETWEEN SOURCEWELL AND 72 HOUR LLC D/B/A NATIONAL AUTO FLEET GROUP TO PURCHASE EIGHT (8) REPLACEMENT POLICE VEHICLES IN AN AMOUNT NOT TO EXCEED FOUR HUNDRED, NINETY-NINE THOUSAND, SIX HUNDRED AND SIXTEEN DOLLARS (\$499,616); AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.**

## **STAFF SUMMARY:**

### **Summary:**

The purpose of this item is to request City Commission's approval of the attached resolution authorizing the purchase of eight replacement police vehicles from Alan Jay Automotive Management Inc. utilizing Sourcewell contract 091521-NAF in the amount not to exceed \$499,616 and to execute all related documents to effectuate the purchase.

### **Background:**

The Fleet Department has implemented a replacement plan that balances the cost of ownership with the operability of fleet assets, taking into account factors such as age, utilization, and anticipated surplus value on the secondary market. Based on this analysis, the vehicles requested for replacement have been approved for FY26.

### **Current Situation:**

The vehicles requested to be purchased are critical to maintaining the effectiveness of the City's Police fleet. These units have reached the end of their lifecycle, resulting in increased downtime and excessive repair costs. The vehicles to be replaced are below:

Staff seeks to utilize the agreement between Sourcewell and 72 Hour LLC dba National Auto Fleet Group (Cars, trucks, vans, SUVs, cab chassis, and other vehicles) No.: 091521-NAF. The initial term of the Sourcewell contract ran from November 4, 2021 through November 8, 2025. On May 30, 2025, the first renewal period was exercised and provided a new expiration date of November 8, 2026. National Auto Fleet Group selected Alan Jay Automotive Management, Inc. to conduct business in the State of Florida. Sourcewell, a municipal contracting agency, allows government entities to cooperatively procure equipment and services at discounted rates. By leveraging Sourcewell's cooperative pricing, the City ensures competitive costs and streamlined procurement, enabling staff to respond quickly and effectively to emerging needs.

### **Why Action is Necessary:**

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-5 Competitive procurement required; Procurement Mechanisms, (3) Cooperative Purchasing. Includes a variety of arrangements whereby two or more public entities have the opportunity to purchase from the same supplier or multiple suppliers using a single competitive procurement mechanism. Furthermore, Section 23-9, Award, (e) The City Manager may award procurements within the delegated spending authority. All other procurements, except emergency procurements, require commission approval for award.

**Cost Benefit:**

The City of Hallandale Beach routinely leverages cooperative purchasing agreements to maximize cost efficiencies and realize savings that would otherwise be difficult for a municipality of our size to obtain independently. In alignment with this strategy, the City has elected to purchase eight new police vehicles from Automotive Management Inc., utilizing Sourcewell cooperative contract #091521-NAF. This approach ensures competitive pricing, streamlined procurement, and supports the timely acquisition of essential public safety assets.
