## SHORT TITLE:

A RESOLUTION OF THE MAYOR AND CITY COMMISSION OF THE CITY OF HALLANDALE BEACH, FLORIDA, AWARDING BID # FY 2024-2025-30 LIFT STATION #12 REHABILITATION PROJECT TO FOSTER MARINE CONTRACTORS, INC., IN AN AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION, FOUR HUNDRED, NINETY-SEVEN THOUSAND, SEVEN HUNDRED AND THIRTY-THREE DOLLARS (\$3,497,733) AND AUTHORIZE AN ADDITIONAL TEN PERCENT (10%) CONTINGENCY FOR A TOTAL NOT TO EXCEED THE AMOUNT OF THREE MILLION, EIGHT HUNDRED, FORTY-SEVEN THOUSAND, FIVE HUNDRED, SIX DOLLARS AND THIRTY CENTS (\$3,847,506.30) AND AUTHORIZING ADDITIONAL FUNDING IN THE AMOUNT OF TWO HUNDRED, TEN THOUSAND, NINE HUNDRED, THIRTY-FOUR DOLLARS AND THIRTY CENTS (\$210,934.30) FROM THE WATER UTILITY FUND TO COMPLETE THE CONSTRUCTION OF THE PROJECT; AND PROVIDING FOR AN EFFECTIVE DATE.

# **STAFF SUMMARY:**

# **Summary:**

This agenda item seeks the City Commission's approval of staff's recommendation to award BID # FY 2024-2025-30 Lift Station #12 Rehabilitation Project (P2132) to Foster Marine Contractors, Inc., as the lowest responsive and responsible bidder, in an amount of \$3,497,733.00 and authorize and additional 10% contingency (\$349,733.30) for a total not to exceed the amount of \$3,847,506.30.

# **Background:**

On October 6, 2021, the City Commission of Hallandale Beach Adopted Resolution No. 2021-121 (Exhibit 2) authorizing the use of the continuing service agreement to retain the services of Calvin Giordano and Associates, Inc. to design Lift Station #12 Rehabilitation Project in an amount not to exceed \$297,102.00, in accordance with RFP #2018-2019-012 — Continuing Professional Architectural and Engineering Services. Calvin, Giordano and Associates, Inc., submitted a design proposal to the Public Works Engineering Division on July 16, 2021 (Exhibit 3).

On April 9, 2025, the City Commission adopted Resolution No. 2025-043 authorizing a change order for additional design improvements to Lift Station #12 Rehabilitation Project in the amount of \$25,975.00 (Exhibit 4). Calvin, Giordano and Associates, Inc., submitted a change order proposal to the Public Works Engineering Division on August 14, 2024 (Exhibit 5).

The intent of the project is to rehabilitate the existing Lift Station #12. The scope of work will include upgrading mechanical and electrical equipment as well as the addition of a new emergency generator to improve system performance, increase system efficiency and reduce system maintenance.

## **Current Situation:**

### Release Date of Bid – August 28, 2025:

The release notice for the Bid was sent to over two thousand four hundred (2,400) vendors including vendors from the City's Vendor list and pertinent vendors that have a City Business Tax License to operate in the City.

Firm	Explanation of Non-Responsiveness
INTERCOUNTY	The firm did not provide a 5% Bid Bond as required for MQR # 3, nor did they provide a Bonding Capacity Letter as required for MQR # 4.

Staff evaluated the responses and determined that Foster Marine Contractors, Inc., is the lowest responsive and responsible bidder (Exhibit 6).

If approved by the City Commission, the construction contract will be finalized, and the estimated Project Schedule is as follows:

Staff have reviewed the bids and the attached Award Information Memorandum (Exhibit 7). The Department of Public Works recommends awarding BID # FY2024-2025-30 Lift Station #12 Rehabilitation Project to Foster Marine Contractors, Inc.

## Why Action is Necessary:

Pursuant to Code of Ordinances, in accordance with Procurement Code Section 23-5, Competitive procurement required; Procurement Mechanisms. (a) Except as otherwise indicated herein, all purchases of and contracts for equipment, supplies and contractual services in excess of the delegated spending authority, shall be based on a competitive procurement process.

Furthermore, Section 23-9, Award, (e) The City Manager may award procurements within the delegated spending authority. All other procurements, except emergency procurements, require commission approval for award.

# **Cost Benefit:**

The replacement of Lift Station #12 presents a strong cost-benefit for the City, as it ensures the long-term reliability and efficiency of essential wastewater infrastructure. By investing in rehabilitation now, the City can prevent potential system failures that could lead to costly emergency repairs, environmental hazards, and service disruptions for residents. Modernizing equipment will incorporate new design standards such as easier access to the controls, valves and pumps which will improve pump efficiency and reduce energy consumption and operational costs over time, resulting in significant savings. The rehabilitation of Lift Station #12 is a fiscally responsible decision that safeguards public health, supports sustainable infrastructure management, and ensures the needs of increased development intensity are met.
