Headquarters and Headquarters Company (HHC) **Executive Officer (XO);**

Battalion Support Platoon Leader. As the XO I was second-in-command of a 150+-man Enhanced Readiness Brigade (ERB) Light Infantry Battalion HHC. I commanded the company in the company commander's absence and saw to the logistical needs of the company. This included water, food, ammunition, training aids, Training Areas and fuel. I assisted the CO in the individual and collective training of our soldiers, NCO's and officers. I was peripherally responsible for recruiting and retention. I was accountable

for the care, serviceability, accountability and maintenance of tens of millions of dollars of equipment from weapons, 9mm pistols to 81mm mortars. Spoons, knives and forks, night optical devices, "secure" communications, handheld GPS's to an equally varied assortment of about 30 vehicles, HUMWV to 2.5 ton M-35A3's, recovery vehicles, four Mobile Kitchen Trailers (MKT's) and smaller trailers.

My Additional Duties included Unit Movement Officer, OCS Project Officer, and Recruiting and Retention.

As the **Battalion Support Platoon Leader** I was the Bn.'s Assistant Logistics Officer. I was the liaison between the five company XO's, the Bn. Logistics Officer (S-4), the Bn. Supply Sergeant and the Bn. XO. I was in charge of the 31-man Food Service and Transportation Sections. By ground, water or air, I was responsible for feeding, watering and otherwise supplying the Bn.'s 600+ soldiers, to include fuel for their vehicles.

With 13 years in the military and as much as I loved it, I had to leave it to complete Paramedic school. It was hard to do with the number of deployments I had done with the Battalion and Brigade. We were called up for Hurricane/ Operation Andrew after Officer Candidate School and my first rotation through Jungle Warfare School, Ft. Sherman, Panama.

There was also Hurricane Georges, a second rotation to the Jungle Operations Training Center and two rotations through the Joint Readiness Training Center at Ft. Polk, LA, the first of which was a "scouting mission for the Brigade" with a TOW Company from the 101st Airborne. In order to complete Fire School, Emergency Medical Training-Basic and Paramedic School, I passed up chances for an Expert Infantry Badge, Air Assault, Pathfinder and Ranger Schools.

I needed to complete the remaining 12-15 hrs. of my
